around a treacherous "S" curve on a narrow, slippery road. Three other buses were just ahead of it and two were trailing.

Swerved Sharply to Left

The boulders tumbled down from a 100-foot high perch with little warning, although the driver of the bus behind said Dymptro (Dan) Karapan, 27, piloting the ill-fated machine, swerved sharply to the left as if trying to escape the falling, death-dealing mass.

This severe saved four persons in the rear of the bus, although one of these died later in a hospital.

Rates Phillips, 27, of Alliquippa, an employe of the Pittsburgh Mercantile company, a J. and I. subsidiary, suffered severe shock and lacerations and is in the Rochester hospital.

The bus, smashed in two, reared against a steel guard-rail, which prevented its rolling down a 35-foot embankment upon tracks of the Pittsburgh and Lake Erie railroad. One of the passengers, Ben Watkins, was hurled to his death on the tracks.

Safety crews from the J. and L. Mill across the railroad tracks, and the Pittsburgh and Lake Erie railroad, volunteers and air raid wardens trying to free the bodies worked for hours in constant danger of another rock fall. A boulder about 35 feet in circumference, hanging cliff beside the 40-foot wide hole left by the boulders which hit the bus.

Work on the wreckage was stopped until daylight, when Police Chief Trevor Jenkins said every body apparently had been removed. All of the dead were identified.

New bitter fighting within the Stalingrad factory area also was reported with the Germans counter-attacking from their block-houses and dugouts but retreating to their lines after losing 200 men and a number of guns.

The Germans were said to be counter-attacking again in the Rheeve area without success and the Russians said they continued morning up operations near Vasilievka Lake.

Soviet information bureau made a pointed denial of a German claim that some Russian troops were encircled between Kallim and Lake Ilmen, northwest of Moscow.

"No Soviet troops are encircled either at Lake Ilmen or elsewhere on the Soviet-German front," the agency said.

Russian Widening Wedge

Two earlier communiques today told how the Russians were widening their wedge in the middle Don corridor, taking huge stores of guns and equipment as they advanced.

The German communique yesterday admitted that the Nazis were on the defensive against the Russian spearhead that had broken through as one of its objectives.

"Organized attempts of separate enemy groups to hold back the offensive of the Red Army have been unsuccessful and have only increased the already great losses of the Germans," the Soviet leader's early communique said.

A special communique reported that 6,000 prisoners were taken yesterday alone.

On one sector, the communique said, "a battalion of enemy infantry, together with the battalion commander, surrendered to full force to our unit." On another two days of battle killed about 6,000 Germans, it was claimed.

Among the towns the Russians listed captured were Kamenskaya, Koleshatov, Nikolai, Morozovka, Popovka, Grekov and Pyodvorka.

The capture of Nikolai, a town some Russian units inside the Ukraine region of the 24-cow Voronezh-Milerovo-Rostov railway.

Kharov, one of the anchors of the German line in Russia, lies 200 miles west of Milerovo, near the Donets river. Rostov, at the mouth of the Don river, is about 120 miles south of Milerovo.

First radio broadcast of the communique created the impression that Kamensk, 40 miles south of Milerovo, had been entered. A later official government version said that the town was Kamensk, which is not shown on available Russian maps but was identified by Soviet sources in London as a large village in the Milerovo area.

On both flanks of the Stalingrad front and on the central front, near Rheeve, west of Moscow, the Russians continued to inflict punishing blows on the foe, the communique said.

As lost in the western Atlantic since Pearl Harbor. Of this total, 220 were American craft.

Since January, American shipbuilders have completed 625 merchantmen, totaling a gross of 8,800,000 deadweight tons, and the Maritime commission indicated that President Roosevelt's 1942 objective of 8,000,000 tons of cargo ships will be met.

The commission reported that 68 of the 84 vessels completed in November were Liberty ships which averaged only 26 days in building, an improvement of 10 days over October, and said that its December schedule indicated the yards will "turn out the required tonnage."

At the same time, a mounting number of destroyers, corvettes and fast escort vessels have been commissioned by the Allies to guard the shipping lanes and harass the raiders. Since their big month, the U-boats have found the pickings getting slimmer and slimmer. Fifty-one merchantmen were sunk in July and August, 33 in September and 25 in October. Shipyards in this country alone delivered 67 vessels in June, 71 in July, 68 in August, 63 in September when a record tonnage of 68, 81 in October and 84 in November.

pliers in six eastern states quota based on the amount of petroleum products that can be shipped into each such with "presently available transportation facilities." Suppliers in turn, are expected to assign quotas for wholesalers and retailers.

Since no supplier, wholesaler or retailer will have more gasoline to sell than his quota, the consumers may find their coupons worthless at times. Either the consumer will go without gasoline or be forced to find a dealer who still has some.

Previously, the supply for the retailer or wholesaler was limited theoretically only by the amount of coupons which they received from consumers and turned into the suppliers.

A temporary limitation on gasoline sales was suddenly ordered in the east last week when it was discovered that the coupons had exceeded current supplies and were being used in the area's petroleum reserves.

Quotas for the six states were announced last night. Ickes' office said the total for the east from Dec. 18-31 will be 365,000 barrels of gasoline, 184,000 barrels of kerosene, 340,000 of heating oil and 282,000 of industrial oil.

Ickes' order followed Price Administrator Leon Henderson's announcement that fuel oil rationing in 15 mid-western states would be increased 10 per cent during Period 3 and that consumers could begin using the Period 3 coupons today instead of waiting until the original effective date early in January. Henderson attributed the move to unusually cold weather in the midwest.

front and the central front west and northwest of Moscow, the Russian offensives were said to have won back more than 800 miles of vital rail lines from the Germans.

Nearly 450 miles of this total was said to be in the Don bend, middle Don and Stalingrad sections.

There, despite heavy snow and hampering drifts, the Russians reported advancing at such speed that they captured Nazi winter warehouses. One advanced group engaged back: "We are distributing Dutch chocolate and Rhine wines to our fighters."

A large force of bombers crossed the Thames estuary this afternoon, headed over the channel toward the continent. They flew at high altitude.

One dispatch said the Russians now held not merely a series of long, straight front deep in major positions, mortar and heavy artillery.

The Germans were into fight reserves into the fighting in an effort to hold the Soviet advance in the area between Voronezh and Milerovo, the troops of Col. Gen. N. F. Vatutin beat down their resistance and stormed to new success, the Russians said.

A dispatch to Pravda, the Communist party newspaper, said the Russian soldiers seemed to pick up new tempo in the increasingly bad weather.

The moon war bulletin related that in capturing one of a large number of populated places, one unit took 2,200 prisoners, along with many heavy guns, trucks and tractors. In another sector, a Soviet tank force plowed into a town and took 170 prisoners.

Another Soviet tank group attacked Germans who had entrenched themselves in a "thicket" the communique went on.

The tank men overwhelmed German defenses and killed about 800.

In all, the moon communique listed more than 21,000 of the enemy killed on all fronts and 29 tanks destroyed.

A battalion of about 800 Germans was killed and 10 tanks were lost when they struck at a Russian position in a railway area southwest of Stalingrad during the night, the communique reported.

British Farmers Face Penalties for Failures

All agricultural workers are frozen into that kind of employment; must report shifts.

Editor's Note: American and British farmers are under high pressure to produce for their own countries. Some steps taken in England may differ from those which we shall travel, despite great differences in food problems of the two countries.

In this second of four columns on the British food production business writers James Marlow and George Ziehe explain the tough controls and cooperative methods the British have set up.

By James Marlow and George Ziehe

New York, Dec. 23.—(AP)—The American farmer now is thought to know, but so is the British farmer. Americans know now—because it has been dinned into them—that they will have to grow more food than in 1943 since much of it will have to go to our allies under lend-lease.

This will happen while American farmers are producing at their never did before. Meanwhile they are seeking better prices and more government help. Many of their workers have gone into the Army or better-paying war plants.

How British Operate

The new British farmer operator is in a tight spot.

All agricultural workers are frozen into that kind of employment. They are registered and must report their shifts. Through the Ministry of Labor which corresponds to Manpower here, the farmer is required to have a certain number of workers on his farm. If he has more, he must have a license for the extra men.

A woman's land army—approximately 60,000 between the ages of 17 and 40—has been organized to do the work of men. They are required to work in groups of units or are assigned in pairs to individual farms. The government pays their services by the government rationing system.

Agriculture Ministry

They receive board and lodging, but a minimum wage of \$3 a week.

If British farmers fall for no good reason or through inefficiency—to meet their production quotas they may be fined or put out of their farms.

In this country farmers can sign up to meet certain quotas. Or they can produce as they please within the limits of government rationing.

When they do participate they are backed by government loans or guarantees.

It is a common thing to happen to them—and that is only when they succeed in it is to lose the loan or a part of it.

The food program in Britain was more intense than here, for there they were turned vacant lots and parcels into vegetable gardens, encouraging city-dwellers to plant and harvest, usually giving to each participant 1/4 of an acre.

Would Alter Labor Laws

Legislative Program for Sharp Revision Is Drafted Tentatively.

Washington, Dec. 23.—(AP)—An all-embracing legislative program for sharp revision of Federal labor laws including suspension of the 40-hour provision as a standard work week, was reported today for presentation to Congress early next year.

In its present form the plan would strip the administration of power to deal independently with labor-management problems.

Instead, that authority would be turned over to a new war labor board created by Congress but restricted by law from laying down any orders and assuming any powers not specifically delegated by Congress.

Outline of Legislation

As outlined by one member of the group, who declined to be named, the legislation would:

1. Suspend the premium pay requirements for overtime work.
2. Outlaw strikes in war industries.
3. Prevent closed shops and maintenance of membership clauses in labor contracts in industries having government work.
4. Amend the corrupt practices act so as to bar labor unions from making contributions to political campaigns.
5. Set up the new war labor board, its membership to be composed of representatives of the CIO, the A. F. of L., the National Association of Manufacturers, the United States Chamber of Commerce, and the public.
6. Revoke the Hobbs bill, which would subject labor unions to prosecution under the Federal anti-trust and anti-racketeering laws.
7. Repeal the National Labor Relations Act.
8. Amend the National Labor Relations Act to give the Federal Labor Board authority to investigate and prosecute labor unions for violations of the act.

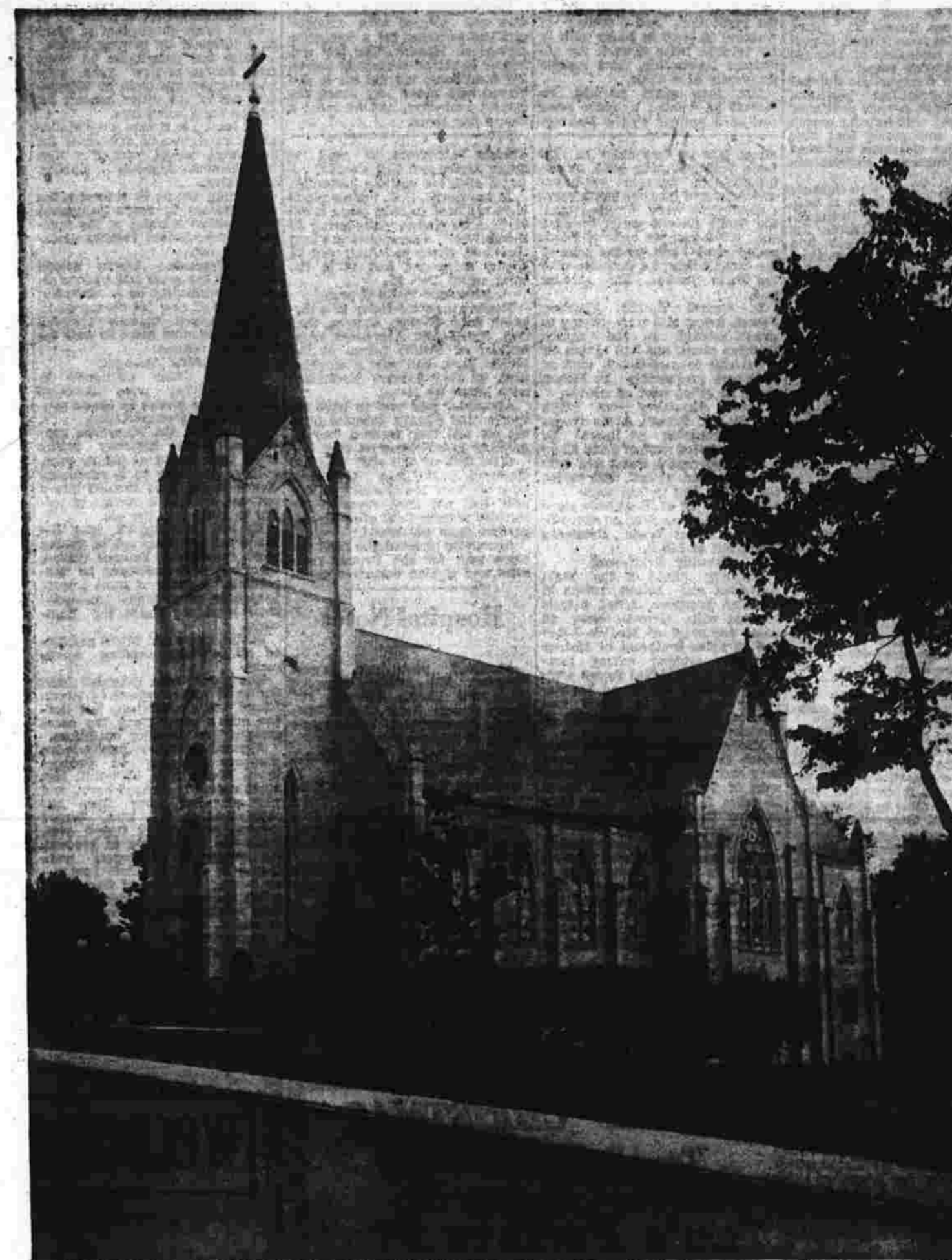

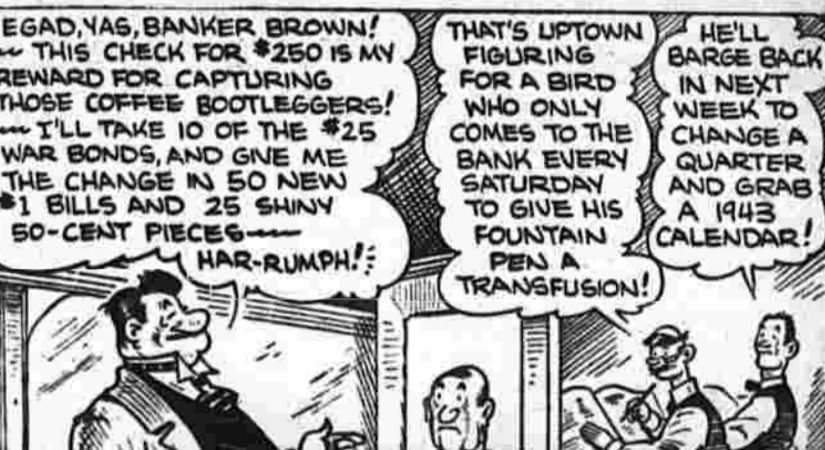

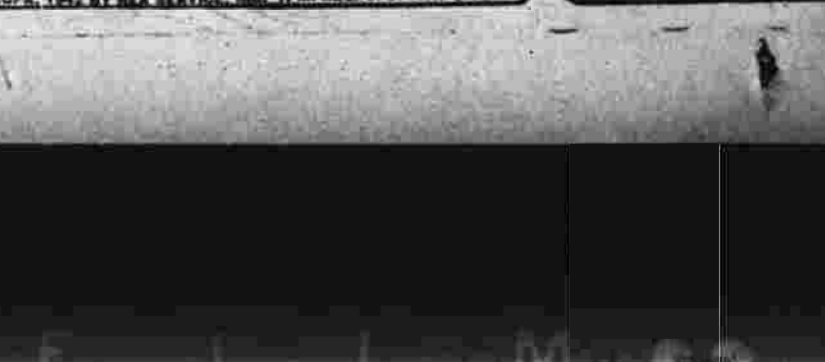

Japs in Desperate Straits Near Buna As Lines Breached

Ranks Decimated by Determined Allied Offensive; Deprived of Sufficient Supplies And Reinforcements By Allied Aerial Action

Headquarters in Australia, Dec. 24.—(AP)—Japanese forces in the Buna area of New Guinea, their fortifications breached in many places and their ranks decimated by the determined Allied offensive, are now in desperate straits, a communique from General Milner said today.

Deprived of sufficient sea-borne supplies and reinforcement by Allied aerial action against their convoys, the Japanese in the Buna area of New Guinea, Australia troops for weeks and subjected to a terrific pounding from the air.

Fortifications Breached "Our attack has breached enemy fortifications in many places, the communique said. "Many hundreds of Japanese were killed and their bodies were buried by our troops. His situation must now be regarded as desperate."

The location of the Japanese fortifications newly breached was not given, but it was assumed they were in the Buna area of New Guinea, Australia, and attacking oil drums and barges near the government station.

Other aircraft raided the air-drome at Cape Cretion on the western tip of New Britain. A heavy bomber dropped 400-pound bombs near a Japanese vessel anchored off Jacquot bay on the southeastern coast of New Britain and later strafed the ship.

An Allied reconnaissance plane, attacked by from six to nine fighters near Jacquot bay, shot down on the beachhead and saw two other drops out of the flight trailing smoke. Two enemy planes received slight damage.
