Food Prices Go High On Caribbean Island
Increases Due to Lack of Shipping; Weekly Wages of Sugar Workers Average \$7.60

San Juan, Puerto Rico, Dec. 29.—The minimum wage board, which has been investigating the labor situation in Puerto Rico, reported this afternoon that the average annual wage of sugar workers was \$12.80.

This brings to more than 21,000 the toll of Axis soldiers reported slain in the region since Monday. Twenty tanks and other arms were destroyed, the newest communication equipment.

The latest official statement also said that in the Caucasus the German counter-attack violently repulsed the Russian forces attempting in a tank assault to dislodge the Russian troops from their entrenchments in captured positions.

The attack, the Russians said, was repulsed with the loss of 300 tanks and 1,000 trucks. The new advances southwest of the Caucasus were reported in position to speed their campaign of slipping up the Axis divisions in the Caucasus and in the Caucasus, and to cut decisively the routes of supply left to the enemy.

Advances of from 15 to 15 miles were reported by the Russian Army in the Caucasus, 12 miles northeast of the town of Stalingrad, 16 miles north of the town of Kotelnikovo, 28 miles southeast, and 10 miles southwest.

An early communique today said the Russian Army was using special detachments to cover up retreat of his troops.

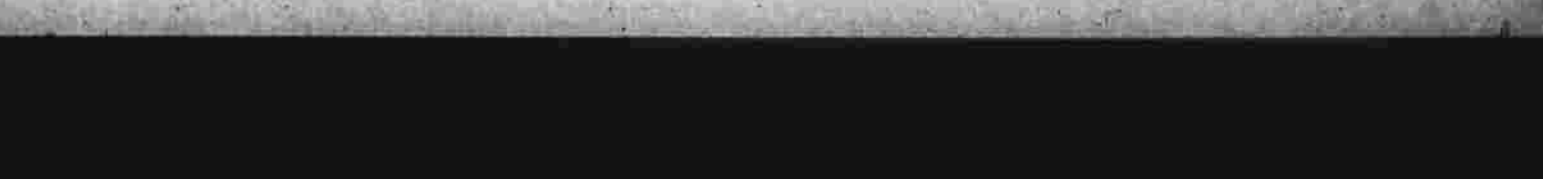
