Moscow, Jan. 1.—(AP)—Leaving the Kalmyk capital of Elista far in their rear, the Red Army has driven to the shores of the great lake of Caspian in an offensive aimed directly at the Caucasus after trapping 22 divisions at Stalingrad and killing or capturing 312,650 of the enemy, Russians reported today. The rush to the shores of the great lake was a 37-mile dash to a point about 40 miles southwest of Elista in the biggest single day's jump of the offensive below Stalingrad.

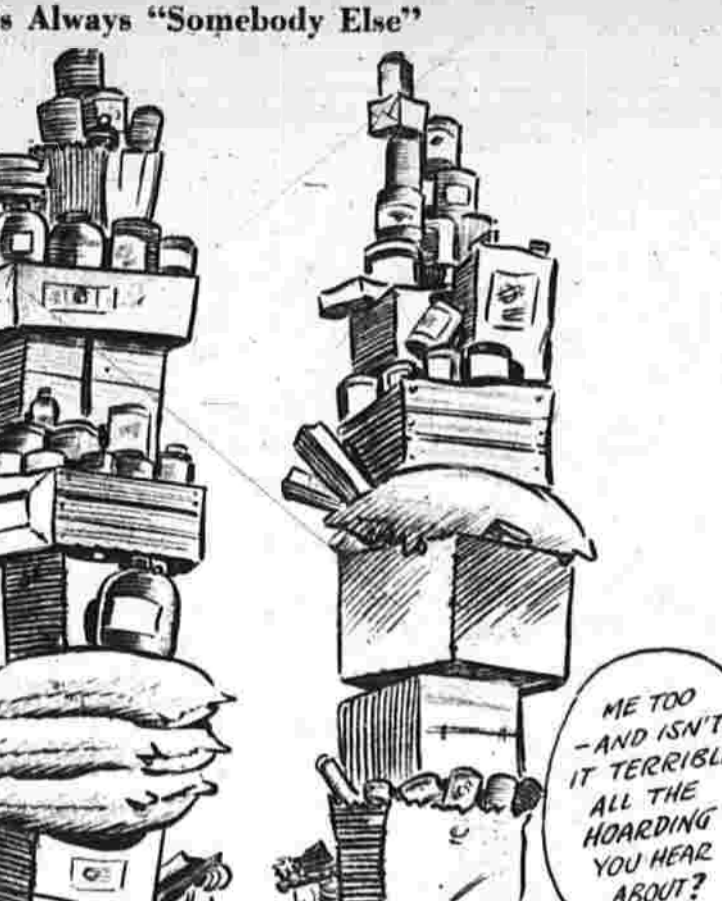
