Tooth Loss Rate Shown By Survey

Americans Can Count on Losing One for Each Two and Half Years of Their Lives as Adults.

Chicago, Jan. 7.—The average American can count on losing one tooth for each two and one-half years of his adult life, it was disclosed today in a table of "tooth life expectancies" prepared by Dr. Henry Klein of Bethesda, Md., a U. S. Public Health Service officer.

The figures showed, Dr. Klein reported, that more than two permanent teeth have been extracted at 18 years of age; about five at 20; about 14 at 42; and finally, at 70 years of age, a white person on the average has lost 23 permanent teeth.

His research also showed that "the average 18-year-old in America has 28.8 serviceable teeth which have an average expect-

ation of 20 years."

Dwindling Supplies Brings About Cut in Fuel Oil Usage

Order Ends Pleasure Driving in 17 Atlantic Seaboard States; Oil For Non-Residential Establishments Cut to 45 Per Cent Now.

Washington, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Dwindling gasoline and fuel oil supplies in the east brought orders for an end to pleasure driving in 17 Atlantic seaboard states today and a cut in the use of heating oil in non-residential establishments to 45 per cent of normal requirements.

The stringent action, announced by the Office of Price Administration last night, gave schools, stores, churches, theaters and similar structures a choice of curbing their use of oil or days of operation or continuing at normal requirements.

Nazis Retake Lines at Side Of Crossroad

Tactically Important Hill Regained in Daylight Counter-Attack; Held for 24 Hours.

London, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Reuters reported Allied headquarters in North Africa today that the Germans had recaptured positions on both sides of an important crossroads west of Matruh.

The heights, 15 miles west of Matruh, which till the lower Don has broken through German lines on a 20-mile front on both sides of the river and has driven within 75 miles of Rostov, key to the whole Nazi salient into the Caucasus, the Russians announced today.

Roosevelt Sees 1943 As Year of Advance Toward Foe Capitals

Leaders Offer Bills On Baldwin Program

Would Create War Cabinet and Grant Government Broad Powers to Cope with Problems.

State Capitol, Hartford, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Acting speedily to implement two of Governor Baldwin's major inaugural recommendations, Republican legislative leaders introduced bills today creating a war cabinet and granting the chief executive broad powers subjective to the United States Constitution.

One of the bills provided that whenever the governor believes that the safety or welfare of the citizens or the efficient and economical conduct of the war effort by the industries or manpower of the state shall require it, he may make such order, rule or regulation as in his judgment will best meet the requirements of the situation then existing, and may alter or revoke the same, subject to certain limitations.

The proposed war cabinet would comprise the governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, chief counsel, attorney general and not less than ten and not more than fourteen citizens.

Its function would be to advise the governor on the "most effective methods of organizing, directing and controlling the resources of the state, of co-ordinating the efforts of all of the manpower and womanpower of the state, and of protecting the property and welfare of the people of the state."

Miracle of Production At Home Backing Nation's 7 Million Fighting Men; Present Congress May Have Historic Privilege of Helping to Save World From Future

Washington, Jan. 7.—(AP)—President Roosevelt confidently told the new Congress today that he saw 1943 as "a year of very substantial advance" toward Berlin, Rome and Tokyo, and he said a "miracle of production" at home was backing the country's 7,000,000 fighting men.

"I do not prophesy when this war will end," the commander-in-chief said, but elsewhere in a thunderously-applauded speech he declared: "The Axis powers know that they must win the war in 1942—or eventually lose everything."

May Have Historic Privilege "I tell you it is within the realm of possibility that this seventy-eighth Congress may have the historic privilege of helping greatly to save the world from future wars."
