Crash Landing Order Obedied

Flying Fortress Flows Hundreds of Miles After Takeoff Accident

Oklahoma City, Okla., Jan. 22.—A flying fortress hundreds of miles from its base yesterday obeyed a crash landing order from the Oklahoma City Air Depot.

The ship was taking off at its Pueblo, Colo., base yesterday a tractor drove on to the runway, dived and veered and avoided collision, but the strain was too much for one of the tires. It blew out as the plane lifted into the air.

Ashua Forman, who carried 11 men, circled the field while the pilot reduced the control tower for permission to attempt a crash landing.

"Fly it to the Oklahoma City Air Depot," the tower message said. "No use having to pick up the pieces here and ship them there."

Forman set out on his long, un-scheduled flight to Oklahoma City. He circled the field when he arrived, picked out his spot, and sent the big plane into a power glide. The tail touched, then the fuselage and, with a shriek of metal, it added to the pile.

Out tumbled the 11 men—uninjured, but relieved.

Jobless Claims Now Declining

Hartford, Jan. 22.—Unemployment benefit payments last year amounted to \$3,235,924, an increase of more than a half million dollars over 1941, in spite of increased industrial activity, James J.
