Democracy in general reserved comment on the financial chart for the state's next two years until they have had a chance to study it.

Proceeding Democratic source came a suggestion that they might oppose the government's proposal to finance most of the state police costs from the general fund rather than the highway fund at present.

The budget proposed by the governor would have the state spend \$3,000,000 more than the budget for the current two years period.

In addition, a number of separate funds, largely self-supporting, bring the total state expenditures to \$12,000,000.

The governor pointed out the Legislature yesterday that the surplus from the current year would be used to wipe out the state's bonded debt. Thus, he continued, the surplus from the coming biennium, estimated at \$3,000,000, could be used to meet post-war expenses.

The only action of the Senate and House yesterday was to hear the budget message and refer the committees were active after the joint session and moved to speed a variety of legislation.

In executive session, the Judiciary committee reported to the Senate and House yesterday that it had virtually eliminated Judge Joseph E. Khan, close friend and associate of Gov. Robert A. Taft.

The bill was supported at a hearing yesterday by Senate Majority Leader Stanley F. Mead, Norwalk Corporation Counsel Paul O'Connell, and Frank Dunne of Norwalk. W. H. Russell of Norwalk Planning board opposed it.

A companion bill to permit New Canaan to make its part of the purchase has already been passed by both the Senate and the House.

Washington, Feb. 3.—(AP)—As the result of a shortage of tin cans and of rubber jar rings, the Agricultural department is considering the possibility of preserving large quantities of vegetables for civilian use by means of brining and fermentation processes used in preserving cucumbers, pickles and kraut.

Official said experiments had shown that several vegetables could be preserved by this method. Studies along this line are being made, they said, at the North Carolina Agricultural Research Experiment station in cooperation with the Federal government.
