Belgorod, 50 miles northeast of Kharkov, was now back by a swift, surprise attack which carried through scores of villages, and the Germans had fortified heavily, were reported.

Leutenant General Moshalenko smashed through north of the city where he encountered German counterattacks. By noon Monday heavy fighting had reached the northern outskirts. Under cover of darkness a second Russian force moved and in a surprise dawn attack smashed into the southern defenses.

The German defenses were reported to have crumbled then before the simultaneous attack from north and south by motor tanks which smashed openings through which ski troops and infantrymen swarmed into the city.

Investia said that most of the defenders, virtually cut off from the city, were killed or surrendered.

The attack was pushed swiftly on to Belgorod, and the gap between Kharkov and a second force widened the gap in the German defense line.

Belgorod is 40 miles northeast of Kharkov. It is a main rail center of Kursk. The Red Army drove westward through a heavy snowstorm. The German defenses were reported to have crumbled then before the winter was described as unusually mild with the steps going up and down with most almost dry as far north as Rostov.

Tough Talk, Weak Policy
 Last night's address by Mr. James F. Byrne, Director of Economic Stabilization, was full of fruits, it and the news, and the continuing policy of the government, was likewise full of concessions.

"There is no way," said Mr. Byrne, "of giving any one group of our people a substantial additional part of the national income or income without hurting all the rest of us."

"We must not retreat," said Mr. Byrne, "in our fight to stabilize the cost of living. The act of Congress provided that prices, wages and salaries affecting the cost of living should be stabilized and except as otherwise provided the act shall not have effect until the date of its enactment, which was Sept. 16, 1942."

"The main governmental action yesterday was proclamation of the standard 48-hour week, working for the extra hours, not hours, in defense activity centers. 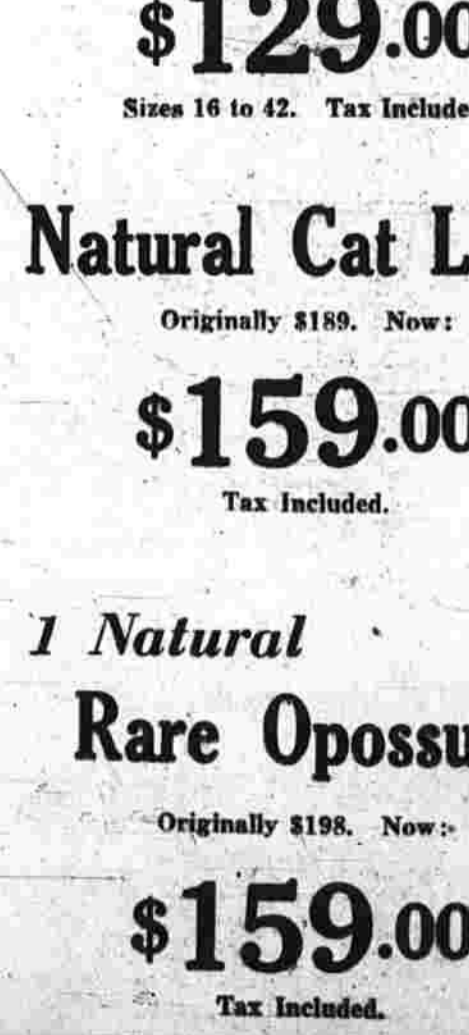
