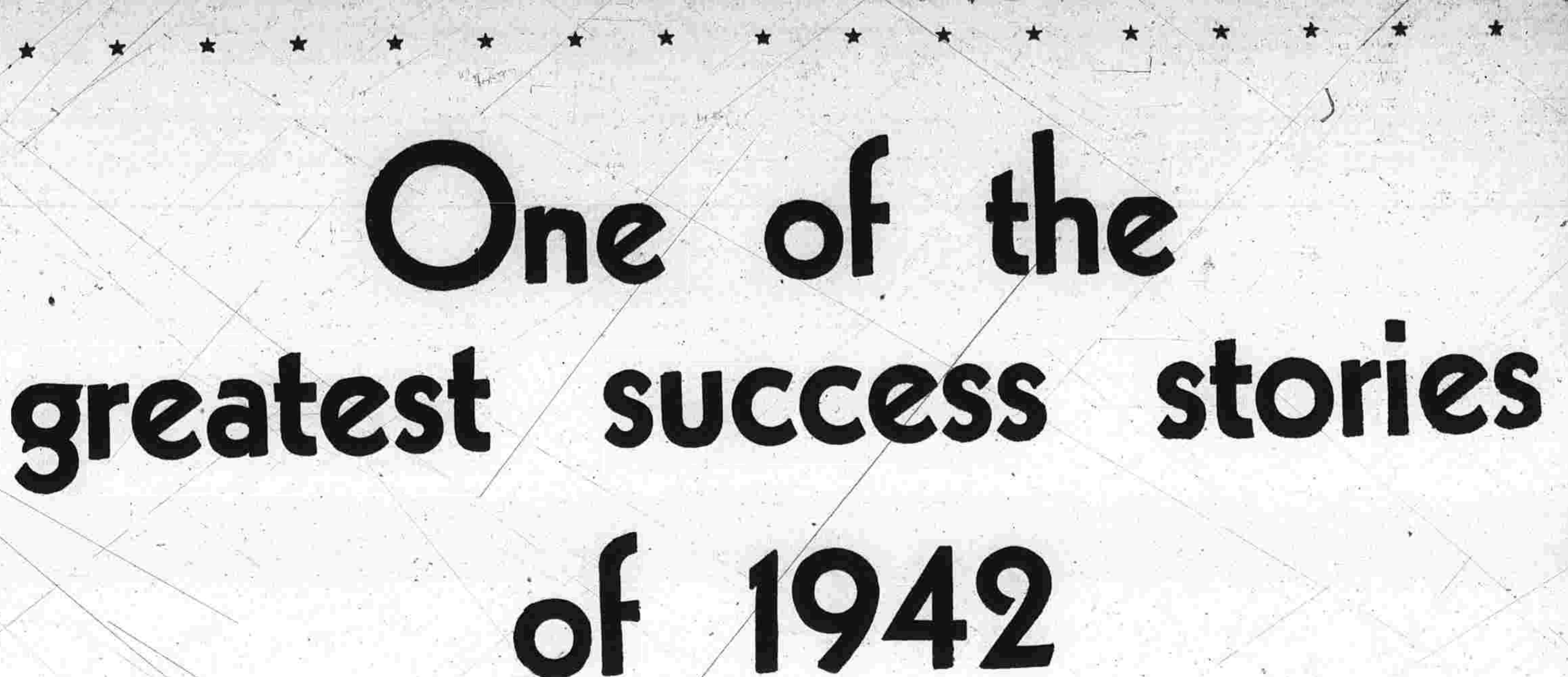

How Service Flags Should Be Displayed

There are rules and regulations about service flags—official ones—just as there are about displaying our national flag. A list of them was recently prepared by Gen. J. A. Van Antwerp, Adjutant-General of the United States. Some of the more important ones are illustrated and described below.

Service flag has a white field with red border. Flags for home use display one blue star for each member of the immediate family in service. In case the person represented by a star dies in service, the blue star is replaced by a gold star.
