C. Following every Red Signal, there will always be a Blue Signal. If time permits, the Red Signal will be preceded by the Blue, but this may not always be effective. The regulations in effect upon the sounding of the Blue Signal will apply no matter whether the Blue precedes or succeeds the Red Signal.

D. The A. R. P. Units will stay mobilized until the "All clear."

E. Until further orders, there will be no audible signal established for the "All clear." The "All clear" will be announced over the radio.

F. The sirens will be tested every Saturday at '12:00 Noon instead of Monday at 11:00 a. m. as heretofore.

G. These instructions supersede all previous orders.

II. During the blackout trial, an air raid drill will take place with red flares used to simulate bombs. The Warden Organization will report the incidents to the Report Center and the various services will be dispatched.
