

Rationing of Meats To Begin March 29; Allows Two Pounds

Butter, Cheese, Other Edible Fats and Oils And Canned Fish to Be Put Under Control at Same Time; Government Hopes to Even Up Civilian Supplies, Cut Local Shortages.

Washington, March 12.—(AP)—Beef, pork, lamb and mutton will be rationed at an average of about two pounds a week for home consumption starting Monday, March 29. Rationing of butter, cheese, other edible fats and oils and canned fish will start at the same time. Through this long-expected action, the government hopes to even up the civilian supplies, which have been curtailed by huge diversions to the armed forces and lend-lease. Local shortages are expected to disappear quickly.

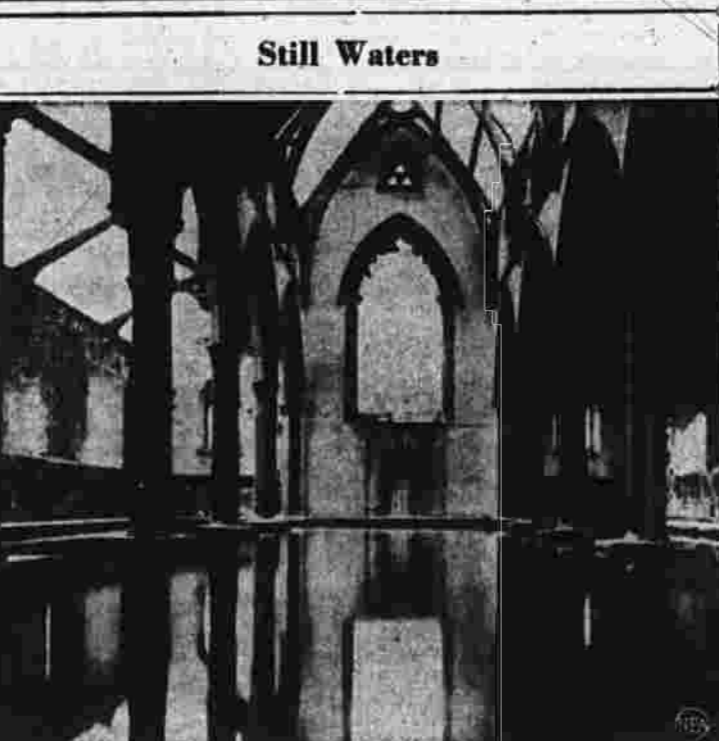
