In women, the doctor may detect the first signs of the menopause or change of life, and be can instruct her what to do to keen fit and how to pass

Naugatuck, March 30.—(P)— A type of footwear known as the "kick-the-Jap" boot has been developed by the United States Rubber company, officials said today. It was designed to give soldiers protection during jungle fighting and in hard mountainous marching.


The uppers, of green canvas, protect feet and ankles against trapical undergrowth and withstand frequent soakings. The soles are of heavy rubber fitted with cleats for sure-footedness in mountainous terrain.

First work on the boot was started in 1941 in cooperation with Army officers and samples were tested under actual fighting conditions.

In a report to the president and Congress, two of the three board members declared that uniformity was necessary "to provide equal opportunity for the economic development of all parts of the country without artificial rate handicaps or preferences."

They urged that Congress amend the interstate commerce act by "declaring that it is in the interest of a proper development of the country as a whole that a uniform classification of freight rates be established for nation-wide application, but with appropriate provisions for exceptions in special cases where differentials are clearly justified."



The debates on the Mackenzie and the Williamson resolutions highlighted a busy legislative day that brought Senate approval of a bill creating a ten-man commission to study Connecticut's judicial system with a view towards its mitegration and reorganization. The measure now goes to the House. 
