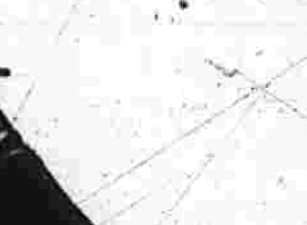

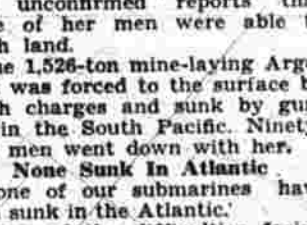

**Asserts Post-War Jobs Would Be Delayed at Least Two Years.**

"What this war is over, there are going to be a lot of men coming from industry and the Army looking for work. There is for that reason going to be a great need for public works. Without plans such work could not be started."

He also suggested that without plans the state might lose "important Federal grants for highway work which are now being planned in Washington."

Harper also attacked the Highway department's maintenance budget, contending that the reduction of \$3,000,000 for the last fiscal year was "the largest cut in the history of the department."
