Brave General To Be Honored

Governor Baldwin Issues Special Statement On Hero.

State Capitol, Hartford, April 16.—Governor Baldwin called on Connecticut citizens today to dedicate themselves to the "same spirit of courage and bravery" which inspired General William H. B. Lewis, who was killed in the Philippines in 1900.

General Lewis, who was killed in the Philippines in 1900, was the first American to be awarded the Medal of Honor for his valor in the Philippine Islands.

In a prepared statement, the chief executive said:

"On Monday, April 19, the State of Connecticut will receive a joint resolution of the Connecticut General Assembly honoring the brave defender of the Philippines, General William H. B. Lewis. It pledges our determination to fight this war through to a victorious conclusion and to retain our last outpost in the Pacific."

As part of the ceremonies honoring General Lewis, the Governor will award the Medal of Honor to the man whose name was attached to the ship which was the first to be named after General Lewis.

and a third strated the Japanese-occupied village of Ome on Timor.

In a recapitulation of air and ground losses in the New Guinea fighting up to April 3, a spokesman for the Douglas MacArthur estimated that the Americans and Australians suffered 10,531 casualties, among which were 4,554 killed or missing and 5,977 wounded. The Japanese reported 4,054 killed or missing and 5,277 wounded. The Japanese had recovered on the other side of the Iijima. The number of men who were killed, United States casualties, many of them air crew, included 2,173 killed or missing in action and 2,144 wounded. Additional figures were broken up into 2,275 killed or missing and 2,577 wounded. The Japanese landed in northeast New Guinea in January, 1942.

Bombers Destroy Power Station

Hartford, April 16.—(AP)—Heavy bombers of the United States Army Air Corps destroyed a power station in the Philippines today.

In the North Pacific, meanwhile, heavy raids on Kiska Island continued. A spokesman said that 11 Allied planes shot down eight Japanese Zero fighters and 10 planes were destroyed. The Allies also shot down three Japanese bombers and destroyed a Japanese transport.
