



For instance, the problem of many persons who didn't collect regular wages or salaries, whose income is variable—professional men paid by fees, farmers, seasonal farm workers, domestics and others.

Under most of the proposed plans, they'd have to file tentative income reports every three months and pay on that basis, then settle up at the end of the year. Some opponents of these plans say this wouldn't work out very well—a first quarterly report might put a taxpayer up in a surtax bracket, for instance, but his income the rest of the year might fall way down, leading to all kinds of complications.

Then there's the argument over who's to pay the increased cost of collecting taxes at the source. A lot of businessmen, figuring on all the extra bookkeeping involved, want to know why they are the first paid for the work.






