She asked if "someone was to be fighting a lazy man's war—a stupid man's war—a soft war at the expense of our sons' lives and our nation."

At a conference with League of Women Voters representatives Sunday, she said that the same agreements on commerce and currency must be made after the war for a lasting peace.

"We shall be longer than you think in finishing it," she asserted, "insisting that the mistakes made since Pearl Harbor in Congress, without a standing international currency, preferably returned to the gold standard."

Advocating in the course of her address, Mrs. Luce might "taxation to the point of confiscation" for those able to afford it, she charged, "a sheer lack of managerial ability" in the handling of the war.

Job Furloughs Seen as Cure

Reuther Offers Proposal as Antidote for Absenteeism Problem.

Detroit, April 18.—(AP)—The Reuther brothers, Walter and Victor, of the United Automobile Workers Union (UAW), today came up with new suggestions which they said would increase the nation's industrial production and stabilize its war-time economy.

Victor, assistant director of the UAW's War Policy division, presented before an audience of 75 Per Cent Don't Buy Blanks. Deciding that government surveys showed 75 per cent of workers absent from work because of illness, Reuther suggested that corporations "should take as much interest in safeguarding the health of their workers as the Army does of its soldiers."

"In plants where workers are working long hours, particularly where they are working six days a week, he said, 'the government should work out an approved system of furloughs to allow them periodic days off to re-energize their energy.'"

A sick worker takes time off, Reuther said, but the furlough should be arranged for a worker showing physical strain as a preventive for major losses through illness.

Opposes Executive Pay Walter Reuther, UAW-CIO vice president who authored the famed Reuther plan, said that maximum production of the nation's industrial machine, told the convention that he opposed executive pay plans because they would open the door to the "bosses' piece-work system."

He called President Roosevelt's "aid, the line" order against inflation "rather late" and added: "Wages and prices must be frozen at the same level. Wages are fixed by the 'Little Steel formula' at September 1941, but the cost of living has increased greatly since that date."

He urged industry-wide wage fixing by a management-labor-government board and establishment of an over-all planning agency to correlate the economic front.

Loggers Told Take Old Jobs

Order Probably Will Set Pattern for Future Civilian Conscription.

Burlington, Ore., April 19.—(AP)—The War Manpower commission ordered loggers to get out of high-paying war industry jobs and back into the woods probably will set the pattern for any future civilian conscription, some observers believe.

The order was issued by the War Manpower commission to solve what it called the No. 1 manpower problem of the west. It applied, some noted, to the same area where loggers staged strikes of similar wage and job issues in the past.

No Opposition Develops. No opposition has developed in this time, A. P. Peterson, D. F. Pearson, assistant secretary of the Northwest Council of Lumber and Sawmill Workers, said in a public statement.

"We're all anxious to maintain fundamental rights gained for labor over a period of years and wartime conditions create emergency situations which all of us Americans are glad to deal with, cooperatively as they arise," he said.

Loggers are in greater volume than ever before.

Worth Lowery, president of the District CIO International Woodworkers of America, concurred.

Observers said the system is the one most easily applied to conscription in other industries since it requires only a WMC order and procedure from Federal agencies.

This is the way the WMC said it would work.

Loggers hope have "out the woods since last Sept. 7 will be trained, given employers furnished with the name and draft books supplying the addresses. The service men will be told to return to the woods. Unless he has a satisfactory explanation why he cannot, he will answer to the draft board. War industry employers, such as shipyards generally, paying at least 10 cents an hour higher basic wage than in woods operations, have been told to discontinue these, Army Navy Maritime commission and other agencies controlling war contracts will apply pressure to see that the men are discharged. Under the manpower freeze plan other war plants will be unable to hire them.

'Work Shoes' for Professionals Require Coupons from Amateurs

Washington, April 19.—Athletic shoe stores by professional baseball players are "work shoes" but the same shoes when used by the professional and amateur athletes are not.

In an interpretation today of these rationing regulations, the Office of Price Administration ruled that baseball clubs may acquire "work shoes" for players without ration coupons.

The club, itself, must retain title to the shoes. Although not considered professional, they acquire athletic shoes only in conformity with rationing regulations as they apply to the average consumer. However, a member of a semi-pro or amateur team who has used his own Stamp letter shoe store by professional baseball players are "work shoes" but the same shoes when used by the professional and amateur athletes are not.

College and schools may furnish athletic shoes to their teams, but must keep title to the shoes.

A non-professional using Stamp letter shoes, he can apply to his rationing board for an athletic ration card, provided there are no lighter stamps in his family. He is not eligible, however, for exchange for athletic shoes.

The president, however, did not attend but called for a rest.

Philippine Resident Commissioner J. M. Elizalde said last night that the ceremony today is the president's first public appearance in honor of the defenders of the Philippines, since his arrival in this country and his illness.

Ban on Extra Gas Rations

No Allowance for Driving to and from Summer Homes in East.

Washington, April 18.—(AP)—The OPA today prohibited the issuance of extra gasoline rations for driving to and from summer homes and in the east also banned gasoline for pleasure boating.

The "summer home" ruling did not interfere with anyone's right to use his regular gasoline ration for transportation to a seasonal dwelling, but forbade local ration boards from providing any extra coupons to facilitate such driving.

"Extra rations of gasoline to enable motorists to drive between their temporary summer homes and their places of work," the agency said, "cannot be allowed this year because of the rubber shortage throughout the country and low gasoline supplies in certain areas."

Chills Potential Inquiries. At the same time, OPA chilled any potential inquiries about "vacation gas," saying, "no vacation and summer home travel can be encouraged while the rubber and gasoline shortages are making it necessary to curtail severely.

Ceilings on Cotton May Be Withheld

Washington, April 18.—(AP)—Government authorities are considering a proposal that price ceilings on cotton be withheld and that the Agriculture Department's Commodity Credit Corporation be given an opportunity to stabilize prices through sales of its cotton stocks.

Determined opposition to cotton ceilings has been expressed by many elements of the industry, and it is known that Food Administration Director Chester C. Davis is reluctant to approve them for a number of reasons.

Agriculture Department cotton experts believe that the CCC could keep cotton prices from advancing to excessive levels by offering the trade supplies from government-owned stocks. The CCC has authority to sell up to 200,000 bales of cotton per month, but not more than 1,500,000 bales in any calendar year, at not less than parity prices.

The government owns large stocks of cotton, but much of it is of low quality.
