It is commonly claimed, especially by those who are more impressed with the theological than the ethical aspects of Christianity, that the emphasis of Easter is to be laid upon the hope or the "joy" of resurrection. The earliest Christians, however, would have been perplexed by this modern claim despite the fact that this claim became a part of Christianity very early. The notion of the immortality of the individual soul came to Christianity from Greek speculation. If differs, for example, from Paul's notion of the resurrection of the dead. Delayed Payment For Conversion

Washington, April 24.—(AP)—The Federal Housing Administration today announced a delayed payment plan for those getting FHA insured loans to convert their home heating plants from oil to other fuels this spring and summer.

FHA said it had notified the 5,000 private lending institutions that operate under its title-one program that initial payments on loans made between Oct. 20 and Sept. 1 may be deferred until next Nov. 1 if the funds are used entirely for heater conversion.

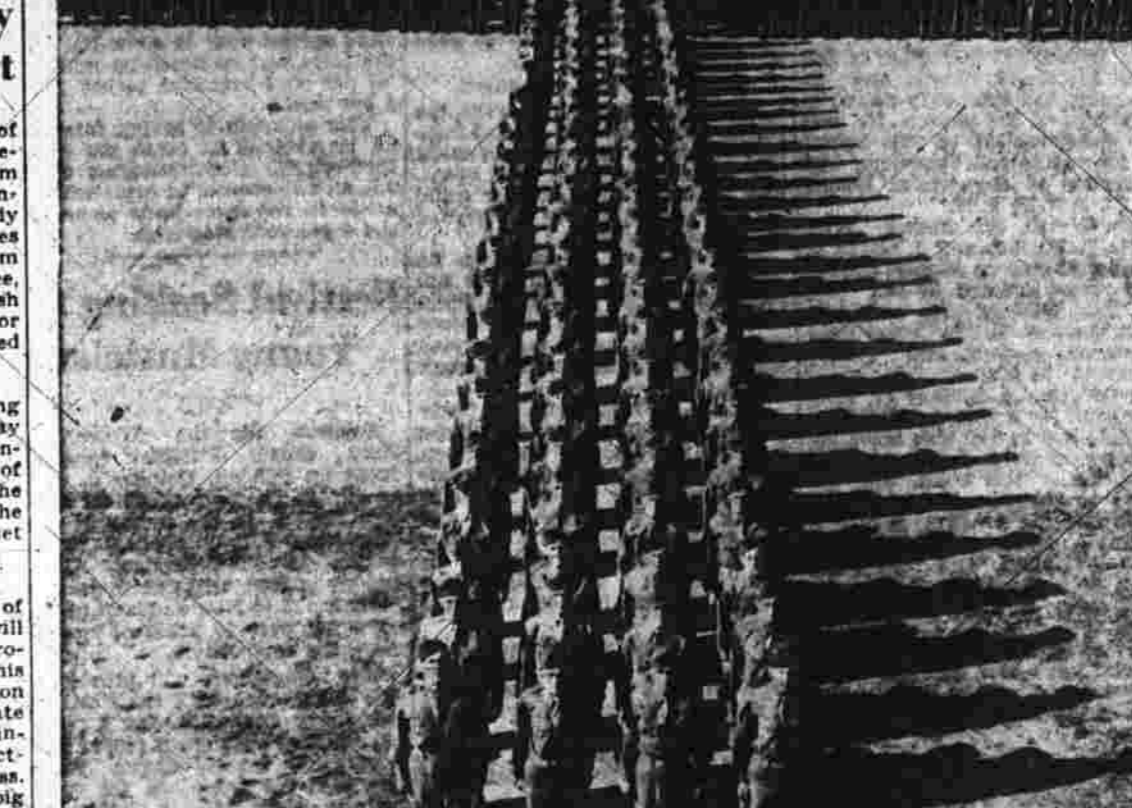
