



### Flat Ceiling Prices Monday

#### Over 1,000 Food Items To Be Arranged in 39 State Towns.

Hartford, May 7.—Flat ceiling prices on approximately 1,000 food items will be fixed on a community basis in 39 central Connecticut towns Monday. It was announced today by Chester Bowles, state director of the Federal Office of Price Administration.

Prices, which will affect poultry, fluid milk, bread, eggs, butter, packaged cheese, sugar, cereals, evaporated and condensed milk, flour and several other commodities will be announced in Sunday and Monday newspapers in the affected areas.

Under the plan, flat ceiling prices would be based on average costs and markups in the community. It is believed, and housewives should be advised that commodities should cost a certain price and no more.

Major steps in drive to hold the line in Connecticut, Mr. Bowles declared, "Now every citizen and every retailer will be armed with a simple, easily understood and effective weapon which will enable him to hit his bill in the fight against inflation. It will increase the difficulties of the black marketeer for it will reveal him in his true light."

In the past, it has often been difficult for both retailers and Connecticut shoppers to know exactly how much they ought to pay for these grocery items because the legal ceiling prices were different in the various stores. Now both consumer and retailer will have a list of definite dollar and cent ceiling prices for their items, size of containers and brands.

In large markets, stores which are restricted by present regulations, such as the large super-markets and those with large volumes of business, must continue to observe their present regulations, which set a maximum price at a lower level than for most independent stores.

Mr. Bowles said that the initial list will make up over 50 percent of the weekly food budget and include items which are most frequently purchased. Announcement of further price ceilings on other commodities will be made as soon as possible and the ceilings will be extended to cover the whole state as rapidly as possible.

The OPA would not comment on whether the new ceilings would be generally lower than current prices. However, Paul Willis, president of the Grocery Manufacturers of America, said at a recent meeting in New York:

"In the face of a reduced volume and an increased cost of doing business, the small grocer has been hanging on in the hope that the overall market regulation program would be repeated by OPA, which would increase through time to save him. Substitution of flat dollars and cents program, Mr. Willis said, is a new blow aimed at forcing many retail grocers out of business."

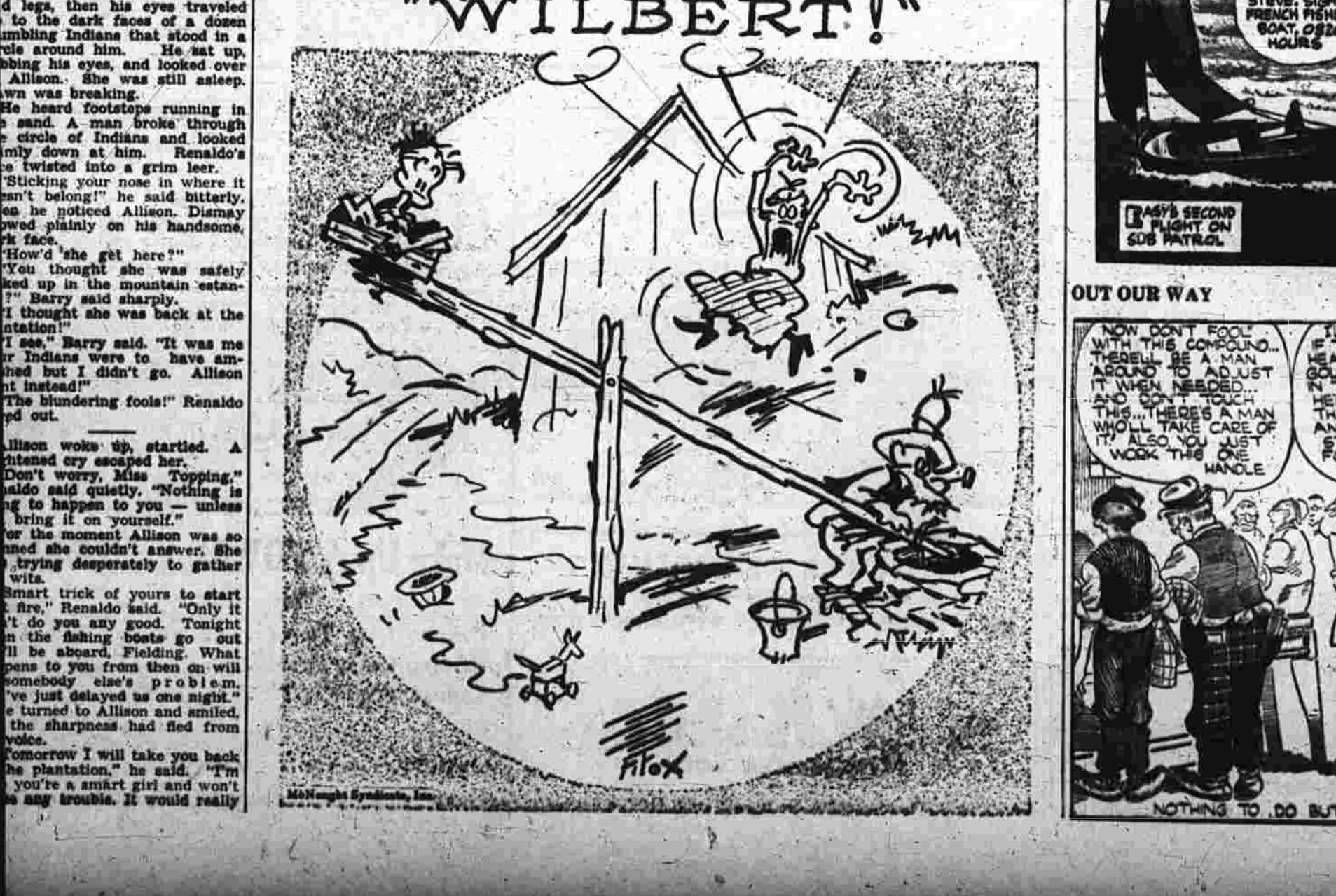
