Time to Kill Weeds When They're Tiny

Hundreds Newly Germinated Will Be Good Competition for Vegetables in Week or Two

New Haven, May 8.—(AP)—Peas, lettuce, carrots, spinach and radishes are up now, but it will be a week or more before corn and squash seed can be planted, and plants of tomatoes and peppers can be set. Looks like a breathless race for the home gardener—or is it? If he closely examines the soil between the rows of young seedlings, he will see hundreds of newly germinated weeds— weeds that, if left undisturbed, will be good competition for his vegetable plants in a week or two. The time to kill weeds is when they are tiny, urges Dr. D. F. Jones of the Agricultural station at New Haven; eradicating them now will save the gardener a immense amount of work.

So, as soon as the ground is reasonably dry, give the soil an all-over stirring with the hoe between all planted rows. A rake will serve as well if the rows are spaced far enough apart to accommodate it. The hoeing or raking is done lightly, just enough to break the surface, thus dislodging the weed roots almost before they've had a chance to take hold.

Can Delay Weeding in Rows Weeding in the rows can be delayed until the first thinning, when the vegetable seedlings are up about three inches. After weeding as you thin, leaving one to two inches, spinach, two to three inches, and head lettuce one foot. At the second thinning, one to two weeks after the first, depending on the weather, every other plant is pulled or cut out. This second thinning of heavy crops can be used for greens.

Plants of hardy vegetables like cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and lettuce are set out now. If they haven't been grown from seed in the frame on the property, small plants can be bought by the dozen at hardware or seed stores. Many of the cabbage group are given permanent spacing when they are set out. Cabbages about 12 to 24 inches apart in rows 24 inches apart, and broccoli and cauliflower set about 24 inches each way. Lettuce six to 12 inches apart in rows 12 to 18 inches apart, and every other plant thinned out later in the season and used for salad.

For plantings of cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower and cauliflower "moss" protection from maggot is a "must." For the gardener, this can be in the form of a durable paper disc to cover the ground at the base of each plant. This prevents the adult maggot, a small fly, from laying eggs on the surface of the soil near the stems of the plants. Discs should be about 4 inches in diameter and can be cut quickly to fit well by making a series of cuts in the center, making a star-shaped opening which leaves all the paper there and will fit tightly about the stems. A slit from edge to center of the disc permits it to be slipped over the stem. When it is in place, cover the edges with soil to keep it from blowing away. Leave until June 1.

Outwits are another troublesome pest not only to newly set cabbage, lettuce, tomato and pepper plants, but to seedlings as well. Sometimes several feet of a row will be "mowed down" in a single night. Plants can be protected when set by wrapping paper collars around the stems. These should extend two inches above ground and two inches below. This collar is difficult to adjust on plants with the paper disc. For maggot protection, for these and for the whole garden in general, a poison bait may be scattered on the top of the soil.

Poison and Bran Mixed Dry One can use a commercially prepared outworm bait, or a homemade bait may be made from one pound of wheat bran and one ounce of paris green or white arsenic. The poison and bran are mixed dry, and then enough water added to moisten the material. This quantity will take care of 3,000 square feet or more of garden. The bait can be scattered along the rows, or a tablespoonful of it can be placed around the base of each plant. It should be applied to the garden in the late afternoon or early evening so it will be in a moist condition when the outworms come out to feed. The same bait can be used for grasshoppers or crickets if they are present in the troublesome numbers later in the season.

Further information on outworms, maggots, and other pests of vegetables can be found in Circular 125, "Controlling Pests of War Gardens," free on request from the experiment station at New Haven or from your local farm bureau.

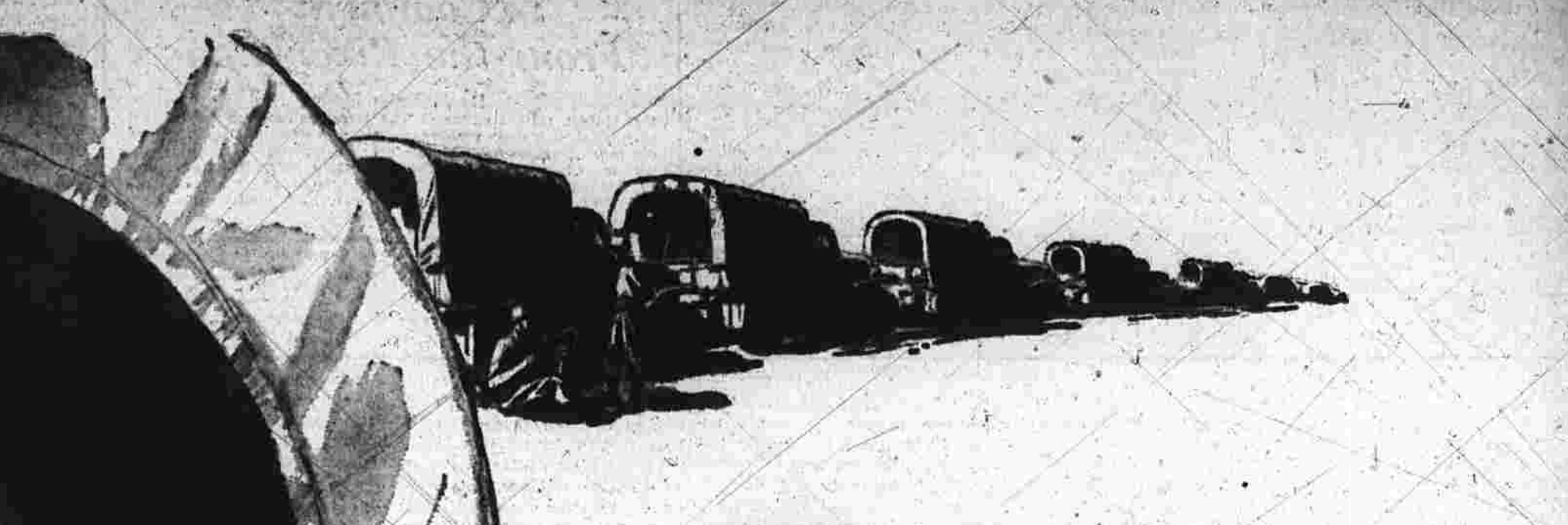
