Miss Gann said teachers have a right to live better economically. She stated that the minimum wage standard for single professional people is \$2,000 and yet the average salary of teachers is far below that. Teachers through their local unions should see that they are economically secured not by bonuses, but by increased wages. She also stated that through these same agencies, teachers should better their schools nationally and hold high their profession.
