It Had Better Be Good
 Few people will bother to read
 the new "directive" in which
 President Roosevelt created an
 "Office of War Mobilization" led
 by former Justice James
 F. Byrnes, who was once opposed
 to bringing order out of confusion
 when he was named director of
 economic stabilization. "The pub-
 lic is getting tired of 'directives'."
 And if it read the latest, it might
 wind up being both confused and
 angry, for what seems a new
 marshaling of great authority.

Instead of this technical direc-
 tive, the public would prefer to
 know it could get it, one simple
 assurance.

In this the final shape of this
 nation's war management? Is

We too, should feel very, very

 sacrifice. But we can at least
 mark their graves, the world over,
 with our humble good intentions.
 They ask of us only one thing,
 that they shall not have died in
 vain. That is their small re-
 quest, our big job.
