America Did Not Beg

We are treating John L. Lewis well enough—too well, history will be certain to record.

Consider the circumstances under which the strike against the closed shop today. Four weeks ago the strike began for the first time. It was called off then, in a moment of temporary and strategic retreat for Lewis, by a truce of two weeks. This truce he magnanimously granted the American people. Like a benevolent giant, he claimed credit for granting his own people a truce.

Two weeks later, he granted another truce. But this time he set his position steadily against Lewis. This time he had to be asked. It was Secretary Hicks, representing the American people, who asked him.

Meanwhile, the War Labor Board was considering the dispute on which this twice-truce strike was based. Last week, it made its report. It left the way open to generous concessions which would mean that Lewis had won more than a reasonable labor leader would expect. It directed the reopening of negotiations between Lewis and the mine operators.

These negotiations reopened last week, and in lack of them was the government's pledge that whatever settlement was arrived at would be retroactive to April 1. Whatever the miners are going to get they will get from that date, through whatever time the negotiations require.

Why are they not at work today? The reason would seem pretty well set: not such an accurate and telling reflection of what is really at stake in this controversy. Mr. Lewis was not "asked" to continue his strike. This nation did not bend its knee and plead with him to keep his miners at work. Secretary Hicks, who performed that act for us two weeks ago, refrained from doing it yesterday. He sent a message to the confidence, and he urged them to reach a prompt agreement and he warned them of the serious consequences of further uncertainty about the nation's coal production, so essential to our war effort. But America did not beg Lewis. And today when the miners are out that is a reflection of the real issue in this case, the issue that cannot be escaped no matter how many times the problem is shifted and turned around and looked at from the point of view of details. It is the issue of whether John L. Lewis can successfully defy his nation's war needs. So far, that question has been answered wrongly. He can go so far and he can get so far with it.

Connecticut Yankee

In at least two instances, the 1943 General Assembly did more than merely turn from a job done to a job not done. It not only gave up its unwelcome schemes, but went forward to express its worthy action. It was like the famous little girl who had a cut in her dress, and when she heard that it had been decided to be good, it was very, very good.

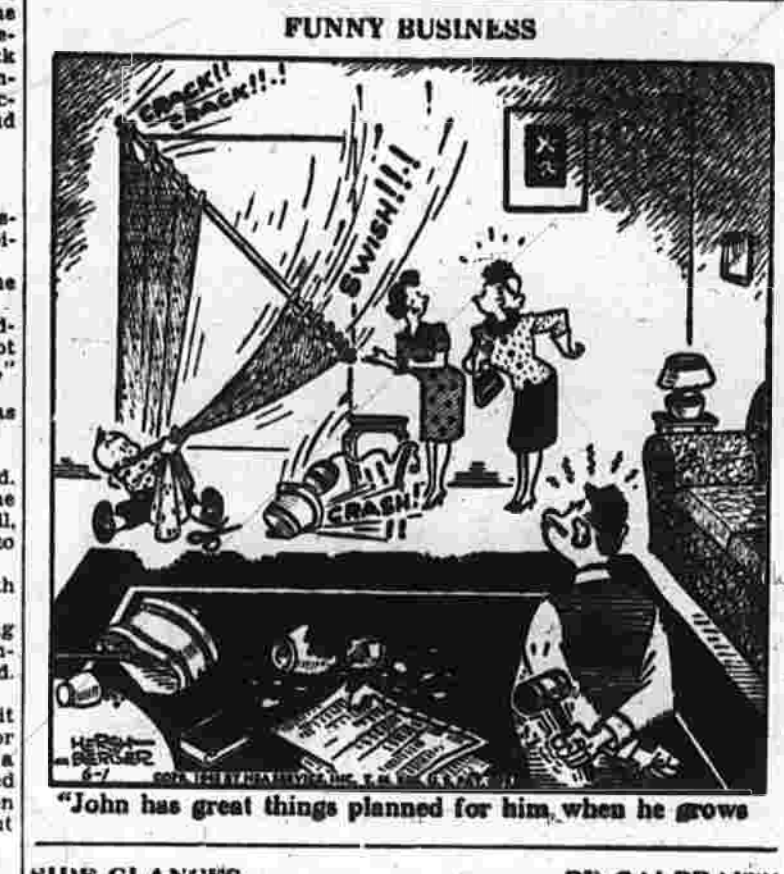

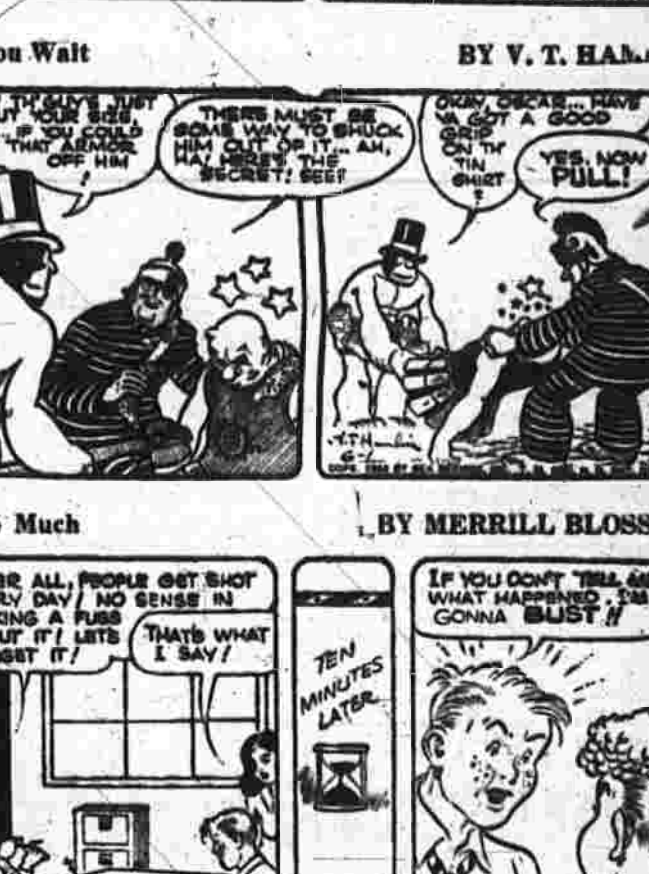

More Than 1,500 Attu Japs Killed; Only 4 Captured

Washington, June 2—(AP)—More than 1,500 Japanese were killed and four were captured during the first 20 days of fighting on Attu Island, the Navy reported today, as operations on the former enemy-held island continued in a mopping up campaign.

The Navy reported that the total number killed in the 20-day campaign, estimated at 1,500, included 1,475 men in the 1,700-man garrison, 25 in the 100-man 1st Marine Division, and 1,000 in the 1st Marine Division. The total number of Japanese killed in the entire campaign is estimated at 1,700.

Destroyer Included in Bag. At the same time the Navy disclosed that the 6th Fleet's 1st Destroyer Squadron, including the USS Lamoth (DD-230), captured 4 Japanese soldiers, 2 of whom were captured during the fighting on Attu.

The number of enemy soldiers killed on Attu could not be estimated, the Navy said, because the Japanese have reported that they have an extensive underground force on the island to start with, and reliable estimates are being sought.

"North Sea" submarines have been spotted in the area.

Enemy Given Bitter Dose On Sea War
