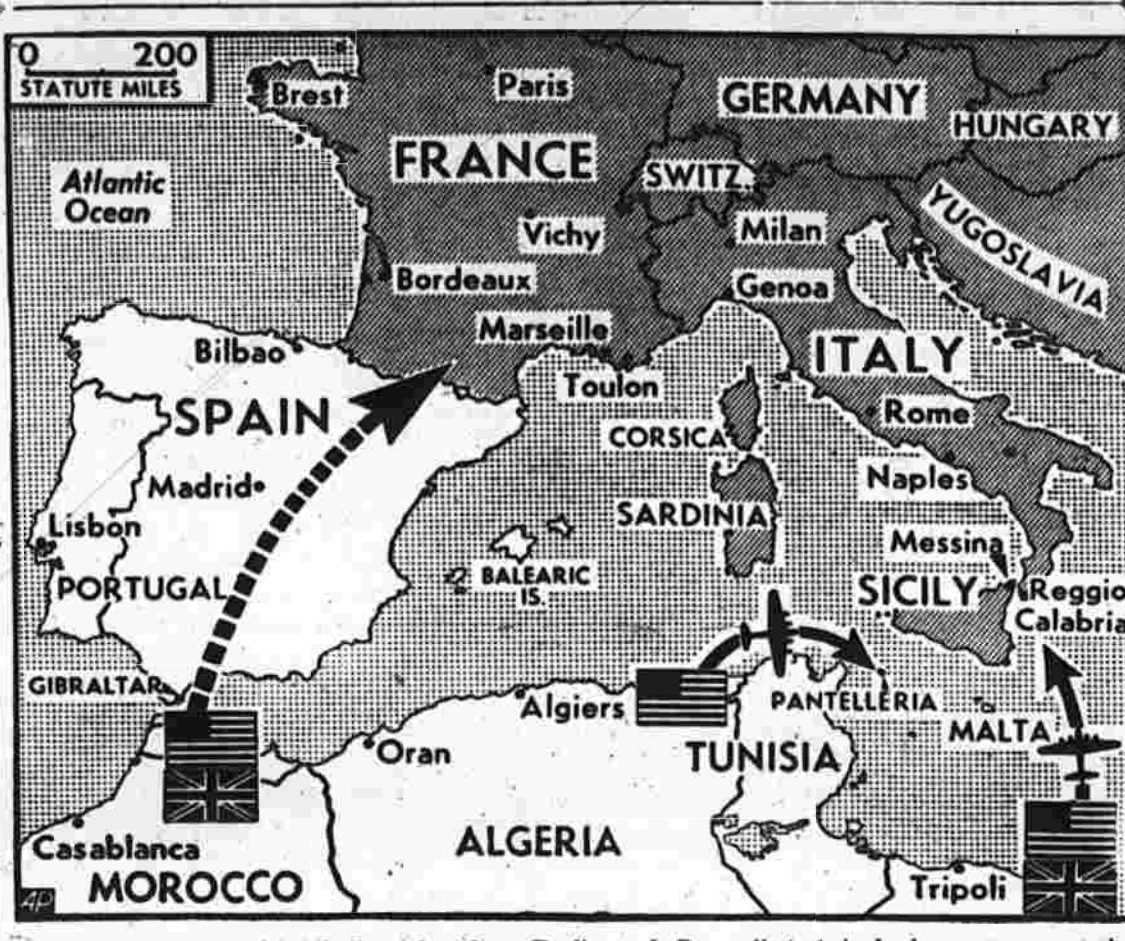

1. FIRST STEP in obtaining your tax refund is to fill out the new tax return form which is available at the post office.

2. BEGINNING JULY 1 you will receive your refund in the form of a check payable to you.

3. ON SEPTEMBER 15 the tax return form will be filed by the post office and you will receive your refund in the form of a check payable to you.

4. TAXPAYER will deduct from his tax the amount of the refund which he is entitled to receive.

5. REGULAR RETURN will be filed by the post office and you will receive your refund in the form of a check payable to you.

Mr. Churchill's Optimism

The exciting optimism in Mr. Churchill's report to Commons is difficult to resist. One would judge, in fact, that he himself found it hard to resist, and was continually forced, after his mind had run ahead with what might happen, to retrace and make his notes one of sober and restrained confidence rather than exuberant cheer.

It was this optimism which made this report far different from any other Mr. Churchill has yet been able to deliver in the course of this war.

It was present in his explanation of the recent Washington conferences. The Casablanca meeting naturally looked forward beyond the present time.

"Nevertheless," said Mr. Churchill, "as the progress of the war became more rapid and the armies marched faster than had been foreseen it became necessary to explore a new field."

When he got into his detailed discussion of the Tunisian victory, he found something significant there.

"There is no doubt," said Mr. Churchill, "from the statements of captured generals that Hitler expected his Tunisian army to hold out at least till August, and that this was the view and intention of the German High Command."

The suddenness of the collapse of these great numbers of brave and skilful fighting men, with every form of excellent equipment, must be regarded as significant, and in a sense characteristic of the German psychology, which was shown after Jena and also at the very end of the last war.

"Though this fact should certainly be noted and weighed, no undue expectations should be based upon it. We are prepared to this war by hard fighting and by this war by hard fighting alone."

Discussing the fact that the month of May, a record month in the submarine war, was followed by the first week of June as the best week all the way through, Mr. Churchill discussed what might be the result of German realization of failure in the submarine campaign.

"If it should be made clear that this hope has faded then they may be seriously disappointed, and they are a people who when seriously disappointed do not always find resources to confront approaching disaster once their reason tells them it is inevitable."

"Again I say—I make the observation in passing—do not let us build on such deductions."

Despite all his reservations, Mr. Churchill is too accomplished an orator and public performer not to know that the heavy strands of optimism thrown into the public mind and woven into an expectation of a speedier climax to the European war than any responsible statesman has yet dared forecast.

Not is the British public in any sense of false reassurance, such as Mr. Churchill deliberately assayed at some of the long African campaign, or before the fall of Singapore, when he must have known definite were coming, but he felt it necessary to keep a cheerful upper lip. No, Mr. Churchill was definitely savilling his hearers, and the free world, to look forward to dramatic attempts at conclusive military success in the near future. He had no reason or need to lead us up that hill of expectation unless he were completely assured, himself, that imaginative optimism is to follow.

Balances Seen In Town Funds

The standing of appropriations, as of May 28, with but two and a half more months to go in the present town year, indicates that the year will end with a balance in nearly all departments.

In the charity department where \$75,000 was voted, \$52,750 was spent against \$60,000 spent at the same date last year. A balance of \$24,500 remains which is certain to be enough to meet the bills still to be paid.

About \$4,000 less has been spent so far this year on highways against last year's figures and a balance of \$24,500 remains in the department. Snow removal cost more than was expected and this shows an over-draft of \$4,600 there having been spent \$11,000 against the amount of \$7,000 voted.

There still remains \$4,400 in the oiling account and the balance for walks and curbs with \$4,000 seems to indicate that there will be money left in this account.

The schools will close with a balance of about \$6,500 on hand. The police account, for \$56,840 was voted has only \$15,400 left and is likely to be over-drawn.

The state county and military tax have all been paid and there is over \$800 left in these accounts. All of the other departments seem to be keeping within their appropriations and there will be a big balance in the water department.
