Anti-Strike Law May Not Prevent Walkout

One of Questions Before Attorneys Seeking to Interpret Bill Congress Passed.

Washington, June 16—Can the anti-strike measure—passed by the House of Representatives last week—prevent another shutdown in the nation's coal mines?

One of the country's top legal authorities on labor problems today said that is one of the questions before attorneys seeking to interpret the bill which Congress passed June 12 to prevent work stoppages in war plants.

The bill—President Roosevelt has until June 25 to sign it into law, or let it become law without his signature—contains penalties for anyone instigating a shut-down in a war plant set by the government.

Congress that the Senate would not even have considered the measure had it not been for the insistence of John L. Lewis in denying the constituted authority of this country's miners.

Twice Stop, Twice Return? Lewis' United Mine Workers, whose contract with the mine owners expired April 1, twice have stopped work since then when no new contract was reached, and twice have returned to the pits under a truce.

The last time they returned to work was June 7 under an agreement expiring June 20. UMW has contended the worst it could do was not a strike, that the miners desired to "trespass" on company property without a contract.

Lewis, however, has been widely criticized for his "trespassing" and the government has seized the mine.

Here are some of the questions asked by the authority mentioned above:

Suppose, before the bill became law, that the UMW leadership told the miners that their truce expired June 20 and thereafter there was no contract without a strike.

Suppose, further, that the miners themselves decided to stay away from the pits. Would the leadership be liable under the law—if it gave given before it became a statute?

Some Continuing Action Senator Connally (D., Tex.), one of the measure's authors, said in answer to this question: "I think so, because such advice, given before the measure became law, would be a result continuing afterward to become law, might be construed as a continuing action."

But other sources said this might not hold true unless there was a provision in the law making the scope retroactive, applicable to any individual striking after the law.

Only the measure provides no liability for any individual striking after the law and staying home if he declines to do so.

Washington, June 16—Funeral arrangements were being made today for Thomas S. Smith, 56, United States collector of internal revenue for the District of Columbia, who died yesterday.

In ill health several months, Mr. Smith died at his home, 4010 Connecticut avenue, N. W., at 11:30 p. m. He was born here April 11, 1888, a son of the late Thomas A. Smith and Mrs. Margaret Harfield Smith, who survives him.

Other survivors include his widow, Mrs. Kathryn Kilgore Smith; two sons, Thomas A. Smith, now serving in Africa with the American Field Service, and Charles P. Smith, a student at Loomis Institute; one daughter, Ellen Kathryn Smith, of Hartford, and seven sisters.

Mr. Smith was collector of internal revenue for the District of Columbia for the past three years. He was making final day payment of the second installment of his 1942 return.

A native of Hartford, Smith entered the wholesale butter and business following his graduation from Georgetown university in 1912.

He resigned from the firm in 1923, entering the employ of Sage-Alan and Company, Inc., and later taking a sales position with the White Motor company of Cleveland.

Named Collector in 1923, Smith was a member of the Hartford staff as state administrator and in addition served as personal liaison representative in the state for the secretary of the Treasury.

From 1935 he was actively identified with committees for the celebration of the president's birthday, taking part in the nation-wide program to raise funds for the combat infirmities nursery.

He was named chairman of the Hartford County Arrangements committee in 1935, and in 1936 accepted the post of state chairman, a post he held at the time of his death.

Rule Set Aside In 9 Provinces

Ramirez Forecasts Intervention in All 14 Areas of Argentina.

Buenos Aires, June 16—Elected governments had been set aside today in nine of Argentina's 14 provinces in the new national administration's "purification" program, and President Ramirez forecast intervention in all 14 before the country is returned to republican forms.

"Fourth, to renew the national spirit and national conscience, which had been suffocated, by infusing new life in conformity with historical tradition—in a word to give the Argentine ideological backbone to the entire country and then deliver it cleansed and renovated in all its values and living forces into the legal hands of the people."

In suspending electrical government in the provinces, the administration has purged governors controlled by the Conservative party in all but two of those in which Federal commissioners have taken over thus far. In one, a Radical (Liberal) party governor was in office. In the other, former President Ramon S. Castillo had previously intervened after defeat of the Conservative candidate.

Referring to the one-day revolt which ousted President Castillo, Ramirez declared: "I do not intend to make a revolution, but in order to solve a acute problem facing the people, especially the working class."

Ration 'Rithmetic Again As Point Values Change

By State Nutrition Committee Recent changes in point values have sent us all back to ration 'Rithmetic again, perhaps just when many of us had become familiar with the old figures. These changes have brought details of restrictions and we hope also, a deeper realization of the significance of our food situation.

Now let us turn the pages of our ration book to the new stamps. Here we find one very pleasant change, and that is the lowering of points on tomato juice. This is fortunate for we are approaching the in-between season for citrus fruits. Oranges are not only high priced but unattainable from the standpoint of flavor and texture. One must keep in mind that the double amount of tomato juice is needed when it is used to replace the vitamin C value of oranges.

Yes, points have changed and careful planning for three meals a day is needed. Every bite counts. Don't plan or cook one bit of unnecessary food. The cheese that once was served as a help-up or before meal snack must now count towards the day's protein supply—for it is a protein shortage that we are facing.

Bans Violating Labor Statute

Injunction Affecting Clothing Manufacturers Signed June 11.

Hartford, June 16—An injunction permanently restraining Kolodny & Myers, Inc., women's clothing manufacturers, of 450 Capitol avenue, Hartford, from violation of any of the provisions of the fair labor standards act, was signed in New Haven June 11 by Federal Judge Smith in U. S. District court, the State Labor department announced today.

The judgment, which ends a case begun by the wage and hour division of the U. S. Department of Labor in 1938, specifically prohibits the use of certain book-keeping methods which the division had held to be in violation of the fair labor standards act.

According to Irving Rosen, senior attorney on the staff of John E. Carroll, regional attorney of the U. S. Department of Labor, the practice to which the division objected was the filing of the decree. The complaint asked for today's judgment was filed in March, 1942.

Rosen asked for the judgment on behalf of Cornelius J. Danaher, Connecticut commissioner of labor, who administers the wage and hour law in this state through an agreement with the U. S. Department of Labor. Evidence on which the complaint was filed was gathered by inspectors working under Danaher's direction.

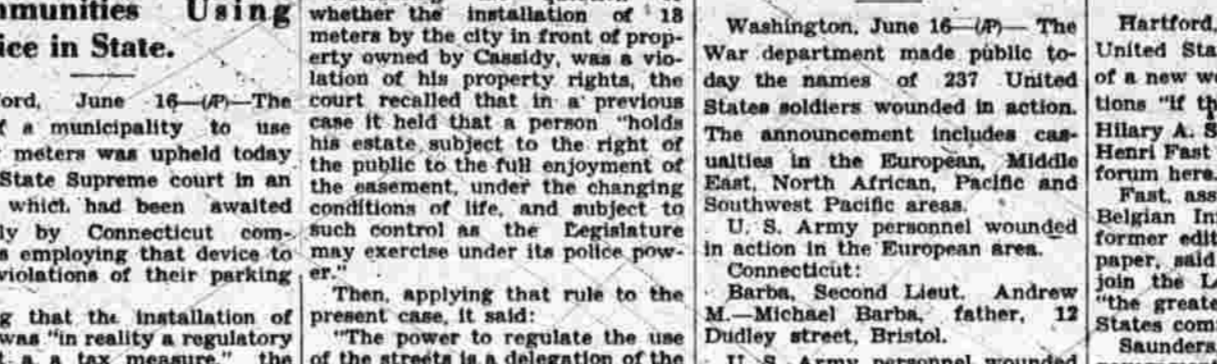
