

By Dr. Thomas D. Masters a fracture, but the pain covers a wider area with a strain. The pain Sprains are usually partial, but sometimes complete, tears of some of the supporting ligaments of a point. These occur when the joint is forced beyond its normal range of movement.

These signs are not too reliable, however, and if any question exists, an X-ray should always be taken.

If the ligament is torn, the extra stretch may save the bone it is attached to. If the ligament is stronger and resists the strain, the bone is likely to be broken. Sprains vary greatly, from those causing a few moments discomfort and limping, to those involving actual rupture of the ligament, which requires weeks to heal.

The ankle joint is most frequently sprained, because it bears the weight of the body and is subject to the greatest strain and labor. For the same reason, a sprained ankle is most disabling of all such injuries.






