



A wholesaler, operating in cahoots with a restalier who was willing to pay more than the wholesaler has a right to ask, could charge the retailer a certain sum above the legal celling.

The only record of the transaction would be the usual invoice on which the wholesaler had listed not actually the full price he had charged the retailer but only the permitted ceiling price.

The extra money—above the ceiling price—paid by the retailer to the wholesaler would have been handed over in cash and never appear on the invoice.

Will Break Own Ceilings

When this happens it is plain that the retailer, in order to stay in business by operating at a profit, will break his own price ceilings and charge his customers more than OPA allows.
