

Warpower Flows. Through Big Inch But Two Weeks Are Required Just To Fill Huge Oil Pipeline

By NEA Service

Philadelphia—Oil is flowing into the Big Inch pipeline down in Texas—oil that in one way and another is destined to be converted into warpower. From vast vats, and through whirring pumps, it is being forced on its way toward tanks and tankers and refineries in the east.
