Wallace Seen Dodging Home Front Issues

Washington, July 26.—Vice President Wallace's bristling in a statement of "isolationists" and "American fascists" provoked a Republican charge today that he was attempting to "take the public mind off the embarrassing messes of the administration" on the home front.

In what was regarded as a significant speech at a Detroit mass meeting yesterday Wallace charged that powerful groups "hope to take advantage of the president's concentration on the war effort to do everything in their power to sabotage the home front."

The vice president said that some of these groups "isolationists" others call them "reactionaries" and "American fascists," are following in European footsteps, all them American "scabs."

He defined them as "small but powerful groups which put money and influence into the hands of the attempt to shape issues."

Commenting on this assertion, Senator Nye (R., N. D.) told reporters it seemed clear to him that Wallace was attempting to shape the vital issue of the president's denial campaign between so-called interventionists and isolationists.

"Such an issue would at least let the administration take the public mind away from the war effort," Nye declared. "But as one non-interventionist, I would be quite unwilling to accept a 'small but powerful' group which put money and influence into the hands of the attempt to shape issues."

Commenting on this assertion, Senator Nye (R., N. D.) told reporters it seemed clear to him that Wallace was attempting to shape the vital issue of the president's denial campaign between so-called interventionists and isolationists.

Keeping Victim Warm and Quiet Is Primary Rule of First Aid

By Dr. Thomas D. Masters, Written for NEA

So many people have been taking courses in first aid that the time has come to evaluate what they have learned and see how effectively they are able to function in emergencies. Unquestionably, first aiders have acquired considerable knowledge of how to prevent accidents, but the percentage of accidents is a major objective of first aid training. And even if they make the curious mistakes to be expected of partially trained persons, they certainly do not know how to do it better than those who have had no training at all.

There are, nevertheless, certain mistakes which seem frequent and common among first aiders. Started by the unexpectedness of some accident, the first aider will come to slip up on some procedure he has learned so carefully, to make an incomplete examination and to treat only the worst injury in the case of several, instead of looking after all. Also, he is willing to use too-soft splints, to gamble on an injury being a strain rather than a fracture, and to be too free with the application of a tourniquet.

The same applies to artificial respiration. It is not done so readily. And almost universally he treats burns poorly—but no wonder, since he has never seen a burn. Present methods are rapidly being outmoded. In general, one should advise a first aider, through inexperience, has difficulty in organizing his efforts and

keeping properly with the strictest of shock. The first-aiders would do well to remember that every accident seems to be unique, but actually they are not. In the excitement of the accident, when everybody is trying to figure out what to do, the important thing to remember is to do as little as possible in the way of first aid procedure.

Keeping the victim quiet and warm is nearly always the essential part. The general impression given to bystanders that the first-aiders probably do not know their job if he fails to do something spectacular. If the first-aiders have learned the principles of first aid, they will be able to practice.

In addition to the need for treating for shock, the first-aiders should be cautioned in splinting the broken end of the bone, move, and to treat every possible fracture as a fracture.

In future teaching of the first-aiders, hypothetical situations and actual cases will be used. He will then be able to give real help before the doctor comes, and possibly to save lives.
