part of Hamburg began Saturday night when R. A. F. bombers carried out the heaviest attack of the war dropping 2,500 tons of explosives and incendiary bombs that hit the city for the first time since the U. S. A. F. have kept up round-the-clock attacks.

The Americans landed the city in daylight yesterday and the Ministry put out the preliminary announcement that Hamburg had been attacked once again by the official communiqué.

Nothing was said concerning the destruction of the city. The official offensive rolled on unimpeded throughout the night with Allied formations crossing the Dover straits to the Calais coast and the German fleet in the channel in brilliant sunshine.

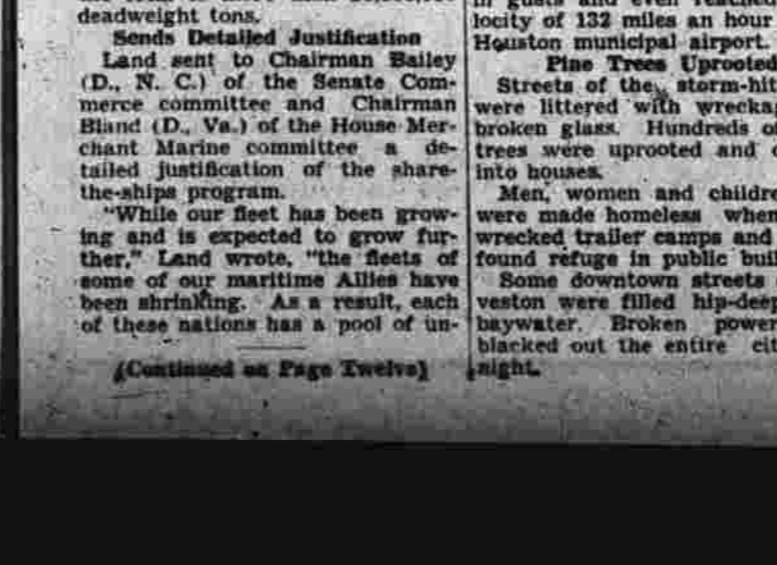
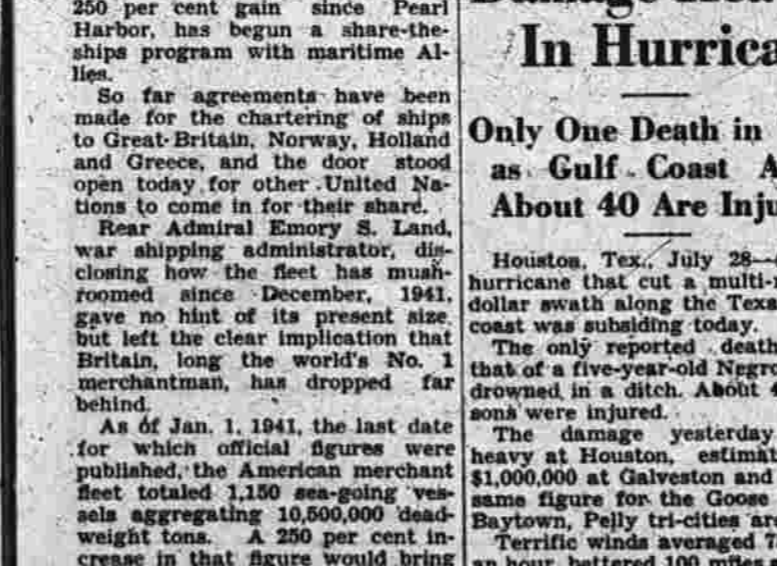
