With those fateful steps, Musso-lini allied himself with Hitler. The Rome-Berlin Axis had been forged, although the formal pact of Italy's alliance with Germany was not to come until the eye of World War II.

Hitler had become Mussolini's only friend in the foreign field. Knowing this, Hitler marched his new Army into Austria in 1938.

From the day that five truck loads of German infantry rolled up to the Brenner pass, making Germany the next-door, neighbor of Italy. Its first gift to the Italians was the anti-Semitic policy of the Fuehrer. was the anti-Semitic policy of the Fuehrer.




