Partly responsible for the piling up of soap, processors asserted, was the large run of hogs which has shattered all records for this time of year. The stock here July 31 totaled 1,026,144 pounds against 300,212,806 pounds a month ago and 18,472,434 pounds a year ago. With the record spring crop, processors are expected to market in a few months, hogs were certain to obtain larger quantities of inedible fat.
