(Continued from Page One) any of the signing of the Atlantic Charter. I would like to see the better future for the world. "First—Respect for the right of self-determination. Second—Government under which they will live. When the Atlantic charter was signed, there were those who said that this was impossible of achievement. And yet today we are on the verge of liberation march on the right of self-determination becoming once more a living reality. "Third—World-wide collaboration with the object of securing for all: improved labor standards, economic advancement and social security. "It happens that today is also the anniversary of the day in 1939 when our American socialist security program was first introduced. "Made Real Beginning "That humanitarian law made real beginning towards the abolition of war in this country. More than 60 million workers with their own contributions to the security for their old age and for their families, their children. Several million are already enjoying benefits. "However, in all fairness, and in all equity, we should extend these benefits to the unemployed laborers, small businessmen, and others working for themselves or for occupation specific purposes. "We should extend social security protection against the economic catastrophe of ill health. "We are now fighting a great war. We fight on the side of the United Nations each and every day. We are fighting for the purposes and principles of the Atlantic Charter. "Not Only Enemies "Today, we stand upon the threshold of major developments in this war. We are determined that we shall gain total victory over Germany, Italy and Japan. We are determined that we will not only be the victors, but we will be the victors in a way that will bring about the permanent peace of the world. "Paul V.
