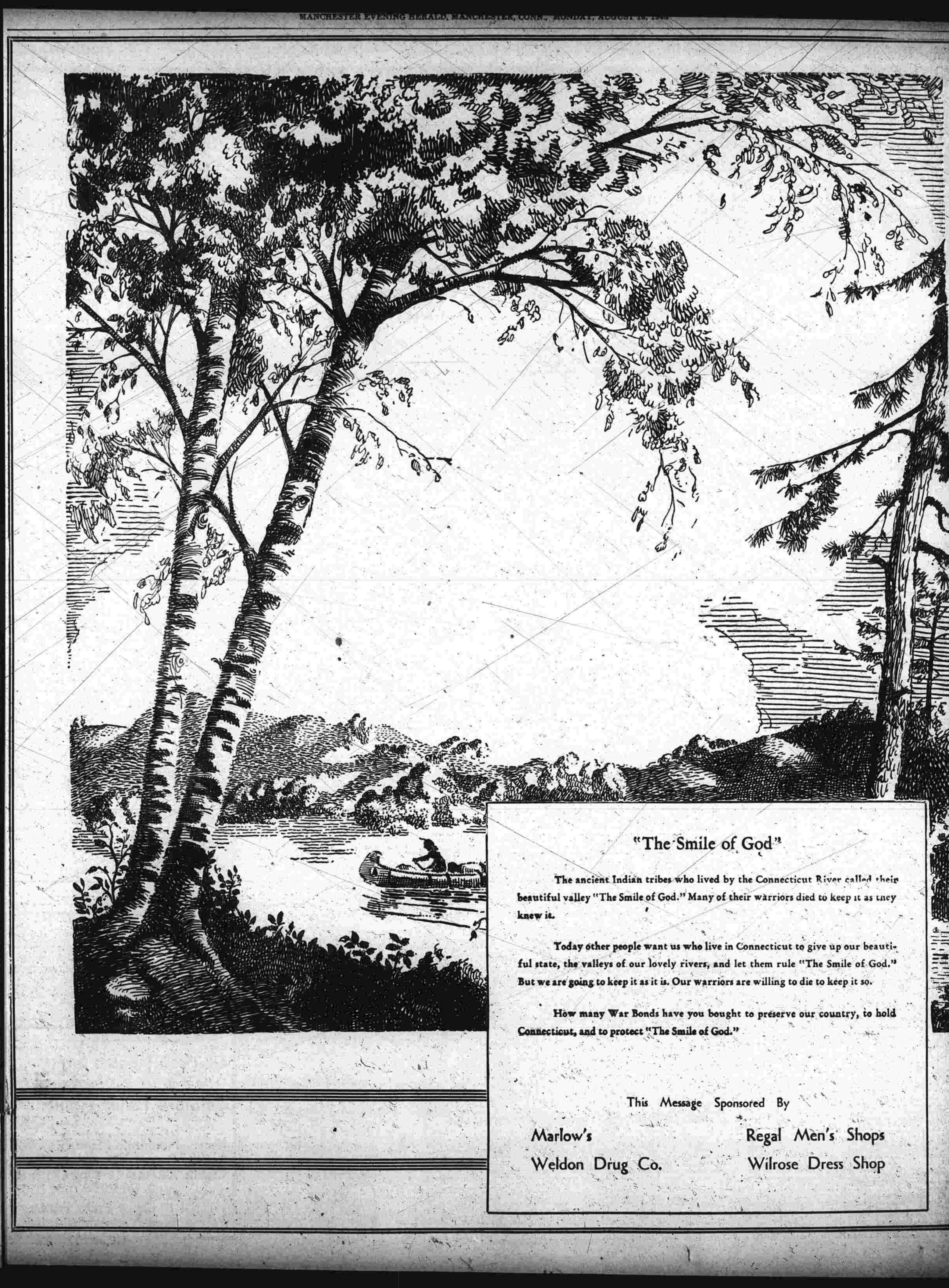

New Haven, Conn., Aug. 16.—(AP)—The number of paralytic cases, actual or suspected, at New Haven Hospital rose to 75 yesterday and the disease, officially described as an epidemic by Dr. Joseph L. Lindo, city health officer, had claimed its second life.

A 23-year-old woman died Saturday after having been treated for several days in a mechanical room which was found earlier in the epidemic.

Not all of the 75 cases including five new ones admitted yesterday were diagnosed definitely as poliomyelitis. Lindo is saying that some were considered "probable" cases and were being given treatment as precautionary measures. It was also pointed out that many of the cases did not involve the severe, paralyzing form of the disease.

While a majority of the cases came from New Haven or the immediate vicinity, some patients were brought here from New York and another from as far east as the Taftville section of Norwich.

Dr. Lindo said yesterday that he had assurance that the city government would cooperate in any preventive measure which might be deemed necessary.

Good Results to Appear The New Haven hospital reported a good response to its appeal for additional nurses to help administer the Kenny treatment, but said more still were needed.

There was no further word from school authorities who said last week that they were postponing the school opening next month, but a group of parents from New Haven and vicinity who had planned to go to Morris resting camp which was being held at Lake Umbagog were kept at home.
