

new regulations of the War Manpower commission which is trying to get help for war production. Under certain conditions they'll be able to hike off looking for bet-ter pay no matter what their boss thinks of it. WMC decreed last April 17 in its

WMC decreed last April 17 in its employment stabilization plan that a worker in an essential industry could not shift to another just for higher pay unless:

He had been discharged, laid off for an indefinite period of for 7 days or more, continuance of his employment would work undue hardship, or he could prove his ability would be more useful for the war effort in the new lob.

Had To Have Permis

But no matter what the reason he had to have a permit—WMC calls it a statement of availability—from his old boss without which the new boss couldn't hire him

If the old boss, however, refused the permit the worker could ask the U. S. Employment service, an arm of WMC, for it. If his reasons were sound, he got it.

But now WMC loosens up the restrictions so a worker can go to a higher-paying job if:

1. His present employment is at a wage or under working conditions below standards established by state or Federal law or regulation.

2. His present wage is below a level established or approved by the War Labor Board as warrant-
