Both Deputy Judge George C. Lessner and Prosecuting Attorney Raymond A. Johnson made it clear that no further gambling will be allowed by carnival groups or other public enterprises in the town limits, regardless of whether payment for any game of chance is made in cash or merchandise.

It was further pointed out by the court officials that Manchester has no definite regulations for the operation of carnivals and prosecution of any shady games operated by carnivals or other travelling organizations of like type are conducted under the existing atste laws, which are very definite in the interpretation of what is constituted as gaming or gambling.

The court made it definite that in the future gambling will not be tolerated in Manchester and gaming, wherever found, will be prosecuted to the full extent of the lsw.


