America is a land of milk and honey. We produce large surpluses of food—far beyond our ability to consume them.

> FALSE Despite a steady increase in food production, we do not have enough food in total to satisfy all the demands-demands sharply stepped up by (1) the needs of food for war purposes; (2) the tremendous increase in civilian purchasing power.

L. Our farmers have accomplished a miraculous food production job in the past few years.
