

At the present 6 per cent normal and 13 per cent surtax rates, with the 10 per cent earned income credit on the normal tax, his total come tax comes out to \$218.60. He's putting 10 per cent of his salary into war, bonds. That's \$350 a year. Under the proposed p'an he could deduct half of that, or \$175. But then if the normal ax were boosted to 10 per cent, his total normal and surtax would at present. If the normal tax were made 8 per cent, the total figure would be \$201.95.

Under the 15 per cent limitation, the maximum deduction ne could get would be \$187.50—if he bought \$375 worth of bonds. The additional bond purchase would give him an additional de-duction of \$12.50, which would save him—this would be the "incentive"—only a couple of dollars on his taxes. They would total 214.76 at the 10 per cent rate or

199.43 at 8 per cent, as com-ared, respectively, with the 217.50 and \$201.95 he would pay he simply maintained his present rate of purchases. The Treasury hopes he's putting all the money he can into war bonds. Perhaps he's using 20 per cent of his income for this purpose buying \$3,000 worth a year.
