Again Discuss War; May Get Italian Offer

Roosevelt and Churchill renew talks amid multiplying signs big development looms.

Washington, Sept. 7.—President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill renewed their discussions today and multiplying signs they are awaiting some momentous development—perhaps a definite peace bid from Italy.

Indirect peace plans have been emanating from Radio Rome for some time, and Enrico Galassi, an official of the Vatican, which might be an agency through which overtures would be made, is on the way to Washington.

Mr. Churchill has been on the side of the Atlantic since Aug. 10, and while his current mission appears to have been fulfilled he has not yet been disposed to return to England.

Statement Marking Time
Here speculation developed that the two United Nations statesmen virtually are marking time.

Evidence that the Allied leaders had completed their planning and were ready to take for months ahead was noted in reports that Gen. George C. Marshall, U. S. chief of staff, had been chosen to lead the invasion of Europe from the gummy school. On the highest authority, it was learned that Marshall is in the States in the European theater, an illustration that preparations for a possible drive across the channel are rather well advanced.

Unaware of the military nature of the mission of Gen. Marshall, the secretary to Pope Pius XII, who is a cardinal and who presumably has the pope's confidence, is in Washington, according to an official source.

There was a hint in Mr. Churchill's address at Harvard university yesterday that significant post-war planning already had been done by the Allies. He spoke of the Anglo-American chief of staff and declared:

"For our own safety, as well as for the security of the rest of the world, we are bound to keep it secret until we are in a position to carry out the war, probably for a good many months, until we have set up some workable arrangements for the peace but until we know that we really give us that protection we must give up from danger and aggression which already we have had to seek across two vast worlds."

May Be In Agreement
Some observers here noted that his choice of words "we are bound to keep it working" seemed to indicate that Roosevelt and Churchill already had agreed on the point.

European political problems, particularly those in which Russia would be concerned, still may be regarded as the attention of Roosevelt and Churchill, although considerable post-war planning seems to have been made toward their solution.

It became known over the weekend, for instance, that a meeting of representatives of the British, Russian and American Foreign Offices and a Mediterranean commission had been formed with Russia's participation.

Retirees Conference Held
The prime minister, speaking at a ceremony in which he conferred an honorary degree from the President's alma mater, reinforced Anglo-American cooperation in the United States in the post-war period.

"For me, as the prime minister of Great Britain, I have proposed a military alliance with Britain after the war. Mr. Churchill said he was not qualified to judge, and would not presume to discuss, whether a post-war combination of staff chiefs would become a party question in the United States.

"I am sure, however, he said, "that it will be a party question in Great Britain."
