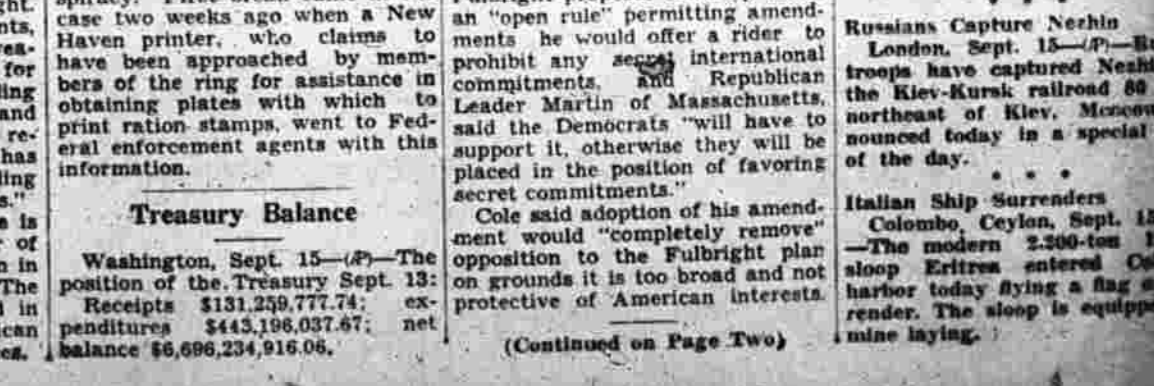

In the Senate where about ten resolutions are pending before Foreign Relations subcommittees, Chairman Connally (D., Tex.) indicated this group will formulate its own proposal.

With a view to attracting at least a two-thirds majority on the floor, Connally says his proposal will be broad and general. The word "force" may be used, it is indicated, to give with Secretary of State Hull's recent speech favoring the use of force, if necessary, to keep peace.

Bad Feelings Are Aroused

Russian and Turkish Papers Have an Argument Over War.

Ankara, Sept. 15.—Bad feelings between Russia and Turkey engendered by the latter's persistent neutrality policy flared anew yesterday when the Turkish newspaper Akşam answered an attack in the Russian magazine "War and the Working Classes" against Germany.

The Soviet publication said that if Turkey would enter the war the inevitable catastrophe for Germany would be accelerated.

"It is easy to say that Turkey's neutrality is to the advantage of Germany," Akşam retorted, "and to want to push Turkey into the war, but difficult to perceive who would be favored if we left our neutrality and, even more, where and how Turkey would enter the war and against whom should we direct her invasion."

Russia had to enter the war in self defense. Turkey's loyal policy during the hard war has been a most solid wall of security for Russia.

Akşam recalled that when Sukru Saracoglu, then foreign minister, went to Moscow to negotiate a mutual aid pact with Russia in 1939, he found himself in the presence of the German minister of foreign affairs, and returned instead of signing a pact which would have weighed Europe against the Axis, came to an understanding with Germany.

It was understood that as a result of the journalistic exchange conversations were held by the Turkish foreign officer and Sergei Vinogradov, Russian ambassador, with the idea of erasing ill-feelings between the two nations.

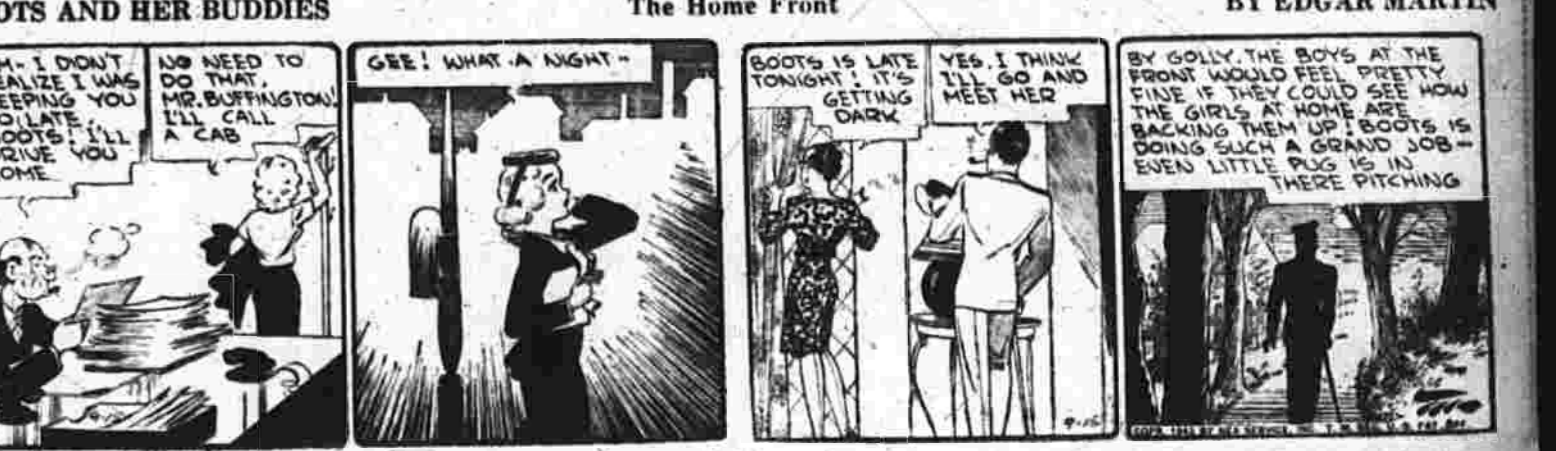

Reds Tear Apart

German Defenses At Dnieper River

Nazis No Longer Hold Continuous Line as Russians Continue to Advance on Kiev to Within 45 Miles of Goal; Berlin Report.

Moscow, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Red Army troops, surging swiftly toward Kiev and Zaporozhye, have reported today to have ripped apart the German defenses at the Dnieper river. The army newspaper Red Star said the continuous Russian forces which preceded the invasion of Italy, was reported in dispatches from Ankara today.

One source said that the Greek island of Samos and the Dodecanese islands in the Aegean Sea, were occupied by the Germans before Great Britain's Ninth Army was reported to have embarked from its Middle East base 400 miles across the Mediterranean in Syria and Transjordan.

Dispatches to London morning newspapers reported that both islands had been turned over to the British. The British occupying forces after their country's surrender to the Allies, were reported to have taken possession of the islands.

Lero, 30 miles from the Turkish mainland, has a valuable seaplane base and is a strategic base for the Italian navy. It is a base for light naval craft and is a much larger island than the other islands.

There was no indication in the Ankara dispatches as to what type of forces were used in the reported occupation operations, but it is believed that the British Ninth Army, headed by Lt. Gen. W. H. Holmes, had sailed from the Middle East base after two years of intensive training.

Mystery as to the exact whereabouts of the Ninth Army, coupled with reports of successful Yugoslav guerrillas who are in touch with the Allied command, suggests a possible Allied invasion of the Balkans was shaping up.

There was some question in London as to whether the British Ninth Army, headed by Lt. Gen. W. H. Holmes, had sailed from the Middle East base after two years of intensive training.

London, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Allied occupation of two island outposts in the Balkans, in a move strikingly similar to operations which preceded the invasion of Italy, was reported in dispatches from Ankara today.

One source said that the Greek island of Samos and the Dodecanese islands in the Aegean Sea, were occupied by the Germans before Great Britain's Ninth Army was reported to have embarked from its Middle East base 400 miles across the Mediterranean in Syria and Transjordan.

Dispatches to London morning newspapers reported that both islands had been turned over to the British. The British occupying forces after their country's surrender to the Allies, were reported to have taken possession of the islands.

Lero, 30 miles from the Turkish mainland, has a valuable seaplane base and is a strategic base for the Italian navy. It is a base for light naval craft and is a much larger island than the other islands.

There was no indication in the Ankara dispatches as to what type of forces were used in the reported occupation operations, but it is believed that the British Ninth Army, headed by Lt. Gen. W. H. Holmes, had sailed from the Middle East base after two years of intensive training.
