One might say that such a report would be measured by the status and public acceptance of those who make the report.

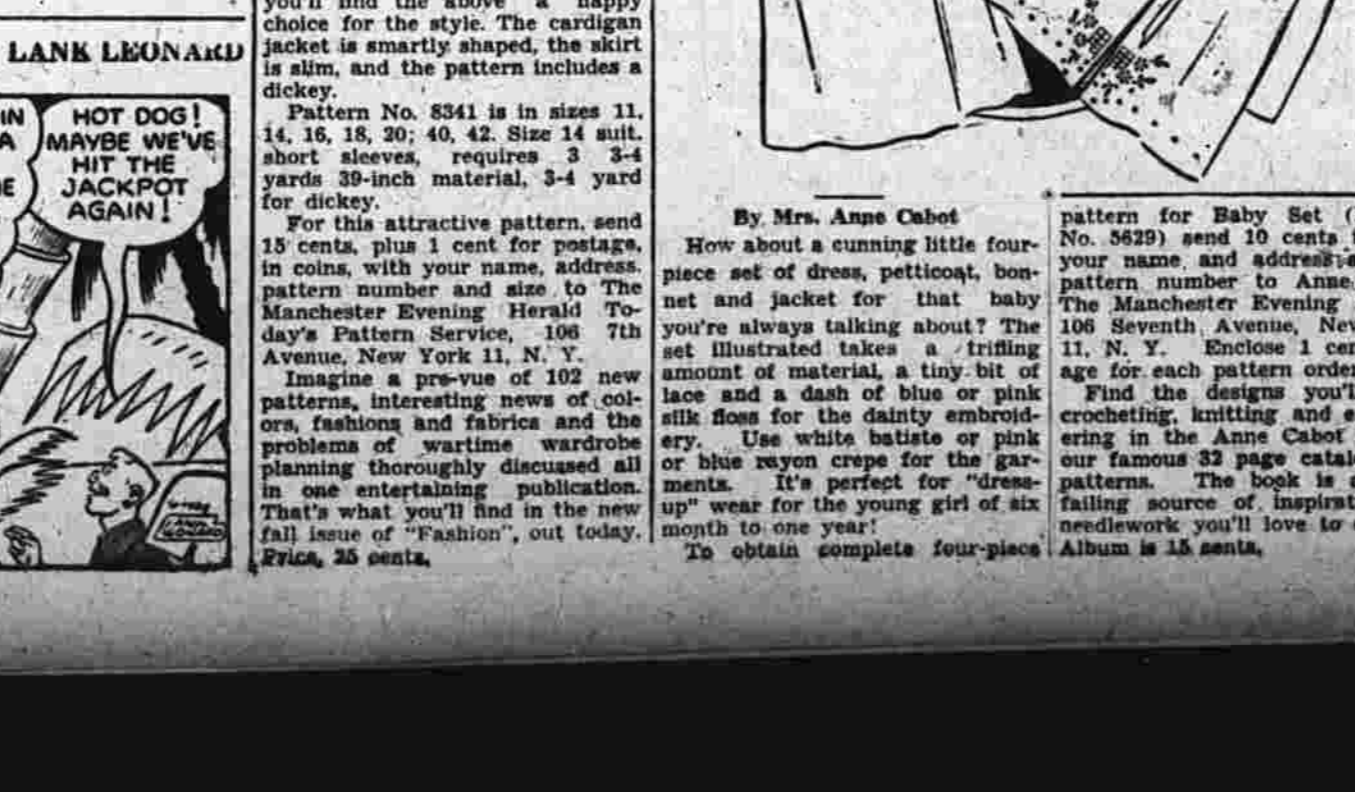
