The matter of deductions also is involved. Under present law, even if returns weren't manda-tory for two-thirds of the taxpayers, a lot of them—particularly those buying homes—would find it profitable to file returns in order to get credit for their payments of interest and real estate taxes. One suggestion is to give every-body a blanket deduction, as is done in the optional short-form returns for persons with income up to \$3,000, and in the short form work sheets for the declara-tions just filed.

To cover those buying homes, some additional deduction for housing might be included. This presumably would apply to all taxpayers, and thus end the complaint of favoritism raised by those who pay rent but can't take any deduction for it even though their rent payments help the land-lord are the taxes.
