No Clear Title Of Ownership

That Is Why Town Hesitates to Sell School Building in Oakland

The Board of Education, in deciding there was no further use for the Oakland school building voted last year to turn it back to the town. Several requests have been made to the selectmen to rent the place and an offer was received to buy the building, but nothing has been done. It appears that there is a question as to the right of the town to sell. The school was erected in 1842 and the town of Manchester owned it at one time used as a joint school for pupils in the Oakland section of Manchester, from East Windsor and later South Windsor. When the town of Manchester annexed a strip of land in the north part of the town from East Windsor in 1842 the school building was part of the district. It remained the ownership of the First district until the school consolidation 10 years ago and the greater part of the time since has not been used as a school.

The fact that there has never been a settlement with the district as to make the town the owner, clear of all claims, is believed to be the reason that the building is not being sold or re-modelled for a house.

Blood Centers Most in East

Majority of These Now in Northeast; Must Be Near Laboratories.

Of the 33 Red Cross Blood Centers in this country, 26 are located in cities east of Kansas City, with the majority in the northeast. So the people in that part of the United States really have the privilege of donating blood to the rest of the country, giving a large part of the life-saving blood needed for minimizing shock among the wounded men, which has previously caused the death of so many.
