





London, Sept. 24.—(P)—A statement by Colonial Secretary Viscount Cranborne that the Italian fleet did not surrender but "moved to designated points under the terms of the armistice" aroused speculation today as to the probable next moves of the former enemy vessels.

On that score, the secretary told the House of Loris in his statement yesterday that "the future of the fleet is under consideration."

Although no official amplification of the remeric was forthcoming, the suggestion was advanced that Cranborne's purpose was to leave open the possibility for Italian seamen to man the ships against the Germans rather than be held as war prisoners.

Boren accused CCC of seizing all of the available protein feed in the hands of processors when the local market price for peanut oil was \$41 a ton, then directing the processors "to raise the price to \$54 a ton and remit the Balance to the corporation."

Cungress had reduced the CCC appropriation for carrying on these very activities, Boren said, so CCC set up this "scheme to thwart the will of Congress and defy control from the constitutional authorities," he declared in a statement.




