Herald-Tribune Speaks Out
It is the habit of the McCor-
mick-Patterson publishing com-
pany to pretend that the only oppo-
sition to its sabotage of the Ameri-
can war effort and the American
war spirit comes from Communist
or radical sources. In the Chicago
Tribune, the New York Daily
News, and the Washington Times
Herald, they miss few opportuni-
ties to stir up vicious trouble,
whether it is with a sensational,
lying story of immorality in the
W.A.C., or glibful speculation
about the status of General Mar-
shall. When they are attacked for
such pedon, they promptly pro-
claim they are the only ones who
Americans left, and that all who
oppose them are either taking or-
ders from Moscow, or from the
one thing worse than Moscow,
the White House with its present
occupant.

Yesterday, as President Roose-
velt castigated the McCormick-
Patterson papers for their lead-
ing part in fomenting the General
Marshall controversy, he had spe-
cial artillery. It was in the form
of two editorials from the New
York Herald Tribune, which hap-
pens to be a leading American
newspaper, which, as an eminent-
ly conservative organ, is an en-
emy to Moscow, and which, as an
eminent Republican paper, is cer-
tainly not under the personal spell
of Mr. Roosevelt.

Mr. Roosevelt was able to read
these two editorials yesterday as
if they presented his own views.
He himself emphasized the fact
that it was an eminently conserva-
tive, "respectable" American
newspaper which so referred to
the "despicable efforts of the Pat-
terson press to spread confusion
among the Allies and disunion in
their war planning."

It is refreshing to find the Presi-
dent so bulwarked in his criticism
of the McCormick-Patterson pub-
lishing plot. The McCormicks and
the Pattersons represent in the
background the claim that they are
preserving and typifying the sac-
red freedom of the press. They
repeatedly seek to persuade their
fellow members of the press that
an attack upon them is an attack
upon all the finest traditions of
the whole American press. That
claim is tommyrot, and the more
it is rebuked by other members
of the American press, as the Herald-
Tribune has now done, the more
the McCormick-Patterson, alli-
ance is a specialist in abuse of the
freedom of the press, and a blot
upon American journalism. It has
sought to do more damage than a
thousand paid enemy agents
might aspire to do. The more
frequently it is rebuked for what
it is the better.

The Aurelio Case
There's a good sample of what
American politics should not be
like in the case of Magistrate
Thomas A. Aurelio, still Demo-
cratic and Republican candidate
of the Supreme Court down in
New York City.

Shortly after he was nominated
