In one instance a tugboat which normally does most of its work and has most of its peacetime customers in the North river left the Army base in Brooklyn before its work was completed in order to serve one of its regular customers anxious to move unessential low-priority cargo.

With no machinery for allocating tugboats, the subcommittees said, the owner naturally attempts to maintain his market and his relations with his peacetime customers.


