Full story may not be told for another decade or more—the department usually waits 15 years before publishing all such papers. The record indicates that up to the outbreak of war in Europe in 1939 the country concentrated on preserving peace in a world beset by Fascist aggression. Then we sought to keep the war from spreading—even to the extent of inviting Japan "as a civilized nation" to join in a plan to save China's integrity and wean Nippon away from her European Axis partners. Japan torpedoed that effort by further aggression in French Indo-China.

Portugal Grants Azores Anti-Sub Bases to Britain

Will Remain Neutral in War, Policy Approved By Britain at Start; Germans May Refrain From Hostilities To Keep Spy Center Open

London, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Tiny Portugal, Britain's oldest ally, has granted the British anti-submarine bases in the Azores islands, the crossroads of the Atlantic—Prime Minister Churchill announced today, but will continue her policy of neutrality on the European mainland.

Churchill, announcing the bases, said that the Azores had been fully informed of the negotiations. The Azores lie 1,000 miles west of Lisbon, the Azores islands from Portugal to the United States.

Would Include Airports "Anti-submarine bases" would include both harbor and air facilities. The Azores are a group of islands in the Atlantic Ocean, west of Portugal and east of the United States.

Amid numerous rumors that the Portuguese, who now are engaged in the biggest military maneuvers of the war, might declare hostility against Japan, Prime Minister Churchill disclosed in the House of Commons that Antonio de Oliveira Salazar, Portugal's premier, had accepted a British request for facilities to aid the Allies in their fight against the submarine menace.

Churchill told the House that all British forces would be withdrawn from the Azores at the end of hostilities. The Portuguese themselves have constantly been reinforcing the Azores garrison to the extent of their limited facilities since the beginning of the war.

The Azores, nearly 2,000 miles east of New York, consist of nine islands, the most important being Horta, a transoceanic communications center and a strategic point for the Pan-American clipper ships. The islands, with a total population of about 255,000, are an integral part of the Portuguese republic and not a colony.

Speculate on Effect The immediate effect of Portugal's decision is the subject of hot speculation in London. It is the most important result for the Allies will be to give them one more valuable base from which to operate.

Washington, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Back at his desk after an extended tour of European battlefronts, Secretary of the Navy Knox asserted today that renewed activity of German submarines in the North Atlantic can be considered "very serious."

Will Be Serious to End "It is very serious. Let's not make a mistake about it. Submarine warfare will be serious to the end of the war."

On the other hand, Knox reported he had observed, on an inspection of the coast of the United States, that the German submarine activity was not as serious as it had been reported to be.

Washington, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Confronted with a new and discouraging report on milk production, the War Food Administration today stepped up plans to limit civilian consumption in all metropolitan areas.

The Federal Crop Reporting Board's October survey estimated that the country's milk production was down 3 percent below the corresponding month of last year, despite an increase in the number of milk cows.

To Extend Quotas Accordingly, the WFA went ahead with arrangements to extend delivery and sales quotas which are designed to hold consumption of fluid milk down to the June level, and of milk products to about 75 percent of the June mark. These quotas already have been put into effect in about 30 metropolitan areas.

The crop board said milk production per cow on Oct. 1 in herds kept by 20,000 of the corresponding months of last year was down 1.5 percent in the North Atlantic states and 4 percent in the rest of the country. Production in the South Atlantic states declined about 4 percent in September, the board said. In the central states, production per cow declined more rapidly than average, the board said.
