### Knit Goods Needed Now

Red Cross Asks Workers Return Garments For Next Quota.

Only a part of the quota of knitted garments which was due from the Red Cross Production Center at that time, and there are still things out which must be included in the shipment to next week if the quota is to be completed. Such things as Army and Navy scarves, Navy turtle neck sweaters and watch caps are really needed, with cold weather rapidly approaching and many of them have been in the hands of writers for several months.

These writers of thanks have received this week by Miss Helen Trotter, chairman of production, from Red Cross Field Directors in places where some of the knitted garments shipped at the end of September were returned. They account for only a small percentage of the number sent, but they give some idea of how much of the garments are needed and appreciated.

The Red Cross, Madison Branch, New York, dated October 12, 1939, as follows:

"Dear Miss Trotter: We wish to express our sincere thanks and appreciation for the 20 Navy turtle neck sweaters we received yesterday. The boys of the 20th Army Central Postal Directory, who are in the front lines, are very much in need of these warm articles of apparel. Sincerely, C. J. Nuttal, Field Director."

From Fort H. G. Wright, New York, comes another, dated October 13, as follows:

"My dear Miss Trotter: Will you please accept our thanks for the 10 Army muffers which reached the office a few days ago. Please assure those who assisted you in this project that they will be distributed among the men who need them most. Sincerely, C. J. Nuttal, Field Director."

And the third, from Lovell General Hospital, Fort Devens, Mass., dated October 12:

"My dear Miss Trotter: This is to acknowledge the receipt of 15 Army sleeveless sweaters from your chapter for the patients in this hospital. We appreciate your prompt action on this matter. Will you please thank all who worked on these sweaters. Very truly yours, Mary Louise Burns, Field Director."

When letters like that come, being anxiously awaited and distributed among those who need them most, and expressing thanks for prompt action, it brings home the real value of the work done by every knitter in every chapter in getting every garment out just as soon as possible.

The Production staff had intended to ship the rest of the quota this and of this week, but because there are still so many articles missing, they have extended the time to the first of next week. The importance of getting those missing articles in the very first thing next week, need not be too strongly emphasized. Please, every knitter, cooperate!

The fact that letters like these are coming also shows that, in addition to being the knitters who need, the knitted garments were also well made, and made according to directions, otherwise they would probably not have been used for the armed forces. So it pays to have things just right.

The amount of yarn to be distributed to the various chapters has been cut down, and each chapter receives an allotment in accordance with performance. Therefore it is necessary that the agreement be kept to get the complete knitting quota in at once if future allotments of yarn are to be satisfactory.

In the case of an unfinished garment, please notify the Production Center at once if you cannot complete it immediately. Someone else can undoubtedly finish it up and enable it to reach its quota.

Just once more admonition—please be very sure that when articles are returned they are rolled to the person who took them out, in order that the records may be kept straight and thus avoid unnecessary confusion and wasted time in tracing articles.

### Should Control Building Sites

74 War Housing Projects Completed or in Construction in State.

Hartford, Oct. 15.—All sites for present temporary war housing built by the Federal government, to be cleared after the war, should be controlled to prevent speculative building "just as objectionable as those removed," said Fred White, administrator of the Connecticut State Housing authority, warmed today.

The Federal government, Mr. White told the Hartford Real Estate board at the Heston Hotel last night, has 74 war housing projects either completed or in construction in Connecticut, providing 17,697 dwelling units. Of this number, 35 projects for 8,535 families are permanent type of construction and remain after the war. The remainder are in temporary housing dormitories and demountable structures.

Connecticut has had the highest number of Federal war housing projects for New England, Mr. White said, reflecting the importance which the state holds in the War Production program.

Disposing Serious Problem

Turning to the post-war developments, Mr. White called this one of the most important and serious problems facing the state and local housing authorities. The former has voted to undertake a survey to determine the status of the 74 Connecticut projects after the emergency.

The State Housing Authority, created by the last Legislature, is thinking more of post-war housing problems than those of the present, Mr. White said. He said that in the period following the war the State Housing Authority has the task of assuming responsibility for providing proper housing without the financial assistance of the Federal government.

Salem, Ore., Oct. 15.—Don't be too sure you can't be drafted just because you're over 38. Col. Elmer V. Wooten, Oregon director of selective service, issued this warning today to 38-year-olds. There was a shipyard worker, he said, who quit his job on reaching his 38th birthday, left his wife and children, picked up a girl friend and started doing the night spots. The U. S. Employment service had a card on him, but he was in effect: "Nuts to you, I'm over 38; they can't draft me."

### Tighten Draft Report Rules

Delinquents to Be Put in Class 1-A; Given to Nov. 1 to Act.

Washington, Oct. 14.—(AP)—Draft-age men who haven't kept up with their Selective Service obligations—including the fellow who forgot to notify his local board of change of address—are to be tossed into Class 1-A after Nov. 1 and ordered to report for induction.

Selective Service, announcing this today, said delinquents who do not respond to such orders will be reported for prosecution which could lead to a sentence of five years in prison, \$10,000 fine or both.

Requirements

Most men become delinquent for failure to do one of the following: Register, return a completed questionnaire within ten days, fill questionnaires truthfully, keep the local board advised of an address where mail will always reach the registrant, report a change of status which would affect classification, report for physical examination, or report for induction.
