5,000 Disabled On Way Home

First Military Prisoner Exchange With Germany Taking Place.

London, Oct. 18.—(AP)—More than 5,000 disabled Allied servicemen, including 17 Americans, who were captured by the Germans on many battlefields during the past months and even years in prisoner of war camps, are on their way home in the war's first military prisoner exchange with Germany.

The exchange of an undisclosed number of disabled Germans in Allied hands is taking place by way of Swedish and Spanish ports. The British Foreign Office announced that the Americans involved would be "sent back to their own homes as soon as they have reached their country" and have communicated with their families.

Three Separate Movements

The Foreign Office said the repatriation was being carried out in three separate movements, with a transport Allied and German casualties to Goetoberg, Sweden, a similar exchange at Barcelona, Spain, and an embarkation of American prisoners, without an exchange, at an Allied port in North-west Africa.

(The War Department in Washington said the 17 Americans included four officers and 13 enlisted men. Their names will be announced as soon as their next of kin have all been notified by teletype.)

In Progress Three Days

A Goetoberg dispatch, disclosing that the exchange had been in progress for more than three days, said the transfer included 3,175 invalids, of whom 2,400 were Allied personnel and 800 Germans.

The hospital ships picking up the exchanges, the dispatch said, were expected to sail by tomorrow.

The German news agency DNB said in a Berlin broadcast reported by the Federal Communications Commission that 5,000 seriously wounded German soldiers, associated corps members and sick merchant sailors would be returned from Britain and Africa.)

The Washington announcement said it was expected that further repatriation movements would be agreed upon from time to time.

Military prisoners had been exchanged with Italy before her surrender, and an exchange was arranged with the Germans in 1941, but was abandoned after Fedor Gusev and Dmitri Borissac, head of the Russian Supply mission in London.

Two Nazi Bombers Downed in Battles

New York, Oct. 18.—(AP)—The first bomber command disclosed today that two possibly four-Nazi bombers were shot down in the Allied shipping were shot down by planes of the Army Air Force anti-submarine units in blasting bomber dogfights over the Atlantic.

Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, Oct. 19.—An unidentified airplane, presumably a Japanese craft on reconnaissance, approached Barber's Point on Oahu Island early today but sped back to sea when caught by searchlights.

The craft, apparently a small, fast-type monoplane, was discovered coming in toward the Naval air station.

"It immediately dived in an attempt to elude the lights, reversed its course and sped out to sea at high altitude," the Navy said.

The Navy added the plane probably was launched from a submarine and that its mission was being diverted to have been unsuccessful.

Washington, Oct. 18.—(AP)—The Office of Price Administration today limited the scope of provisions for preparing special ration stamps for securing necessary food.

The Executive committee of the Office of Price Administration today said that it was necessary to restrict the use of special ration stamps to the purchase of necessities for families on the non-occupational military in their "A" books.

The amendment specifically excludes persons desiring necessities for the operation of a business or occupation. In such cases, an individual must have the necessary qualifications for supplementary ration stamps on an occupational basis.

Also banned are special ration stamps to transport food to temporary or seasonal homes when residence in them is not required by occupation.

The amendment is effective Oct. 23.

Solons Agree Schools Underpaying Teachers

Debate Has Drawn Picture of Closings in Many Parts of Nation As Better Jobs Beckon.

Washington, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Sensate debate last night in the Senate on a bill to provide \$300,000,000 a year for Federal aid to the states for schools agreed upon in the House on Oct. 15.

The debate has drawn a picture of the nation, of a teacher shortage growing because of entrance of teachers into the armed forces and transfer to better-paying jobs, or hiring of substitutes who, in the words of Senator Hill (D., Ala.), "in normal times would be considered qualified for teaching."

Low of \$18.15 Weekly

Senator Hill, a co-author of the bill, submitted a tabulation showing the average weekly wage of teachers on 52-year-a-week basis, ran from a high of \$50.08 in New York to a low of \$10.75 in Mississippi in 1942. "And, remembering that the minimum wage is a uniform increase since."

He added that 50 per cent of the teachers got less than the average. The bill would divide the proposed \$300,000,000 to be apportioned among the states on the basis of average daily attendance in elementary and secondary schools.

It would increase the maximum of salaries on condition that the states continue to pay out of their own funds the annual salaries they paid on Feb. 1, 1943.

\$100,000,000 to be used to equalize minimums spent for education in the various states. Senator Tamm (R., Ohio), opposing the bill, declared that would result in \$26,000,000 of the \$100,000,000 being paid to 12 states.

Center of Arguments

Argument over the proposed appropriation has centered on these points:

For the appropriation—Proponents declare that educational opportunities should be equalized so that every child should have the same chance, and that some sections, particularly rural areas, are backward in their educational opportunities. They argue further that schooling is a local and state responsibility.

In reply, opponents argue that Federal subsidies for schooling would ultimately destroy local determination in education, lead to Federalized bureaucratic control and ultimate general domination. If the Federal government could pay the salaries of the teacher and what shall be taught, they argue further that schooling is a local and state responsibility.

Would Have Affected Draft

In discussing legislation, Senator Hill told his colleagues that "if we had given this help even five years ago, we would not be faced at this time with a situation which has the consequences of this action—in fact, the overwhelming chances are that we would never have been forced to draft fathers."

"If we had given this help, the Army would not have been forced to expend on the illiterates who have been inducted from \$300 to \$600 per man in an effort to teach them to read and write, a sum of money more than sufficient to pay for educating a child for eight years in many good schools throughout the nation."
