

The number of persons coming here from any one country must be in proportion to the number of persons who, living here in 1920, had the same national origin.
(It would work like this: If

1920 the only persons living in this country were 2,000,000 of Swedish origin and 1,000,000 of British origin, then Sweden could send yearly 100,000 emigrants and Great Britain 50,000.) From early in American histor the number of persons of British origin here outnumbered those from other countries. Now Great Britain's quota is higher than any

other country's. 165 Share of Eligible The number of Chinese-origin persons here in 1920 was so small in comparison with other coun-tries—Ireland (Eire) with a population of only 3,000,000 has a yearly allowable quota of 17,853—that a quota of 105 would represent its share of eligible immigrants.

If more than 105 Chinese were to be admitted yearly then the quota regulations would have to be broken for them. Opponents of be broken for them. Opponents of the pending measure predicted its passage would be the beginning of a breakdown in immigration laws. The American Federation of La-bor opposes lifting th ban on the Chinese—and is supported by the American Legion and the Veter-ans of Foreign Wars—on the grounds that immigration of Chi-nese would take jobs away from returning service men.
