was for propaganda purposes—staged to boost morale on the German home front. Highly colored accounts of these raids are reported to be appearing in German newspapers graphically describing the vast amount of damage allegedly done.

The speed of the planes which

the Germans have been using in these attacks, picked up by the searchlights as they cross the city, has been the subject of some comment here, however. The Daily Telegraph said it is believed they are ME-109s—very fast twin-engine monoplane designed primarily as night fighters and fighter-bombers.

"This machine obviously flies about 300 miles per hour with a top speed of possibly 400 miles per hour," The Telegraph said.

No signs of abatement

Government relief efforts are increasing, but private efforts are approaching the limit and the severity of the famine shows no signs of abatement.

The disease toll is averaging four times normal. Typhoid, malaria, cholera, dysentery and other diseases are rampant. Some typhus also has appeared.

Isolated looting has been reported at some points in Bengal as the populace sought food. Agitation meetings have been held in a few places, but not on an organized basis.

In a military way, Bengal is one of the most strategic provinces in India. American as well as British and Indian troops are stationed there.

member the unions asked for a 30 per cent hike, with a minimum increase of 25 a day. The proposed hike would cost the railroads about \$40,000,000 annually and would be retroactive to April 1, 1933.

There will be "considerable talk" of ordering a strike poll at today's conference, said T. C. Cashner, president of the Switchmen's Union of North America, while another brotherhood leader, Harry Fraser of the Order of Railway Conductors said a strike referendum was a "possibility." Other members of the operating brotherhoods are the Locomotive Engineers and the Locomotive Firemen and Engineers.

Cashner said that in the event a strike vote is approved, "we'll set the date for a strike and let somebody else make a move."

Might Authorize Similar Action

Should the brotherhood decide to take a strike vote, similar action might be authorized by the non-operating railroad unions, which have one million members. That group has asked for wage boosts of 20 cents an hour with an hourly minimum of 70 cents, the proposed increase coming about \$20,000,000 a year. A second emergency board named by President Roosevelt is considering the case.

At the Washington conference labor leaders criticized the administration's wage control policies but Mr. Roosevelt gave no indication he would agree to modify them. He did, however, suggest that a committee be appointed to determine whether the government's figures on living costs are adequate, the labor chiefs said.

Labor spokesmen said that some progress was made in solving pressing problems. They urged revision of the Little Steel formula, but Whitney said Mr. Roosevelt made no definite commitments regarding the railway wage situation.

**Propeller Output Increase High**  
East Hartford, Oct. 22.—(P)—Under the pressure of war effort Hamilton Standard Propellers division of United Aircraft corporation has increased its production of warplane propellers more than 24 times since September, 1939, according to announcement by Sidney A. Stewart, general manager of the division.

Counting the production of its licensees the increase at the beginning of 1944 will be more than 60 times the output at the beginning of World War II four years ago.

In the full year of 1939 Hamilton Standard turned out 1,066,191 pounds of aircraft propellers, even at that time the largest production in the world. Present production is accomplished with less than seven times the pre-war manpower and less than five times the 1939 factory space.

With its licensees Hamilton Standard is now producing slightly more than 76 per cent of all American warplane propellers, and is represented on more than 30 major types of Army and Navy planes.


