Woodcock Announces Five-Point Program For Protective Work

Hartford, Oct. 27.—So long as the Army says that civilian defense forces are military necessities, the Connecticut protective services will be kept in good working order, State War Administrator Harold F. Woodcock said last night.

He was announcing the five-point program adopted in Washington for the eastern seaboard protective services.

Notes Occasional Changes. Noting occasional changes in the protective system, Woodcock emphasized that "because such modifications occur from time to time there is no reason to feel at all that we should relax our vigilance in Connecticut."

The five-point program includes: 1. Twenty-four hour operation of an adequate warning and mobilization system for civilian defense forces.

2. Maintenance of the present trained personnel.

3. Periodic drills, including blackouts, to maintain civilian defense efficiency.

4. Continued enforcement of civilian defense forces of Army-prescribed regulations.

5. Continued stress on community service work by civilian defense agencies.

Program Announced Jointly. The program was also announced jointly by the Office of Civilian Defense and the East Coast Conference of Civilian Defense Directors in Washington.

Simultaneously, Lt. Gen. George Gruent, commander of the military of civilian defense workers.

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New Process Makes Soles

Parts of Hides Not Generally Used Treated With Secret Chemical.

Middletown, Oct. 27.—Successful laboratory development of what was described as a new process of manufacturing shoe sole material, was announced here today by the Russell Manufacturing Co., makers of friction materials and woven products.

C. H. Sherer, vice president and general manager, said limited production would start Nov. 15. It will begin in a "pilot" plant which will prove manufacturing methods and will have an estimated weekly capacity sufficient for 50,000 pairs of shoe soles.

Sherer said the product was the development of Gustav Walters, director of belting and automobile research of the Russell Manufacturing Co., adding: "Mr. Walters, after two years of research and experiment, processed parts of fine leather hides, not generally used, with tanning, a secret chemical compound developed at the company laboratories."

Tests Compare Favorably. Tests showed, said Sherer, that it compared favorably with the high quality sole leather in flexibility, abrasion, resiliency, moisture absorption, and certain other characteristics.

Mr. Sherer asserted that the treated leather was not merely an emergency development. "The new material," he declared, "is a commercial product which, it is hoped, will not only relieve the present and future leather shortage, but will become a standard material in the post-war era."
